



TERRORIST ATTACKS IN FRANCE, 2015-16

January 7-9, 2015: Brothers Said and Cherif Kouachi attack the Charlie Hebdo offices in Paris killing 12. Al-Qa'ida in the Arabian Peninsula claims responsibility for the attack. Two days later, Amedy Coulibaly attacks a Jewish deli in Paris, killing four. He drew inspiration from the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS).

April 19, 2015: Sid Ahmed Ghlam murders a woman and plots to attack a church in Paris. He was associated with ISIS operative Abdelhamid Abaaoud who was killed during a police raid in Saint Denis, a Paris suburb.



August 21, 2015: Ayoub el-Khazzani opens fire on a train from Amsterdam to Paris, but passengers subdue him. He had ties to Abdelhamid Abaaoud.



June 13, 2016: Larossi Aballa kills a French police officer and his wife in Magnanville. He drew inspiration from ISIS.

February 3, 2015: Moussa Coulibaly attacks three soldiers guarding a Jewish Community Center in Nice with a knife.



June 26, 2015: Yassin Salhi beheads his employer and attempts to ram his vehicle into a chemical facility in Lyon. He had ties to Islamic extremists groups.

November 13, 2015: Nine ISIS-directed assailants conduct a series of attacks in Paris at seven locations, killing 137 and injuring over 350.



July 14, 2016: Mohamed Lahouaiej Bouhlel conducts a vehicular attack during Bastille Day celebrations, killing 84 to date.
