EXERCISE SUPPORT UNIT

NJOHSP's Exercise Support Unit designs a variety of discussion-based and operational exercises to address a broad range of topics related to counterterrorism, cyber -security, resiliency, and other federal, state, and local initiatives. Utilizing FEMA's Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program (HSEEP) guidelines, the Exercise Support Unit provides subject matter experts to assist with exercise design, development, facilitation, evaluation, and post-exercise improvement planning. TERRORISM AWARENESS AND PREVENTION

The Terrorism Awareness and Prevention (TAP) program raises the awareness of terrorism threats to the whole community through special outreach workshops. The TAP program informs first responders and the general public on how to recognize and report suspicious activity in an effort to mitigate acts of terrorism. Through a one-hour presentation, the speaker(s) elaborate on the goals and agendas of both domestic and international terrorist groups, outline the eight signs of terrorism, and provide guidance for reporting suspicious behavior. The speaker(s) are available to deliver the program during daytime, evening, and weekend hours. This program is provided at no cost as a service to the community.

REGIONAL INTELLIGENCE ACADEMY

The New Jersey Regional Intelligence Academy (RIA) is a cooperative educational initiative between NJOHSP, New Jersey State Police, and the Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) program. The curriculum is developed for law enforcement, first responders, the private sector, and intelligence analysts, and it focuses on the tradecraft of critical thinking, intelligence analysis, and intelligence-led policing. Programs are developed in conjunction with DHS core competencies for intelligence analysts, as well as competencies identified in Intelligence Community Directive 203, Analytic Standards. These programs serve as design strategies, systems, and activities that provide for intelligence and information exchange and sharing across the region.



ACTIVE SHOOTER RESPONSE



NJOHSP's Active Shooter Response Training provides overall awareness of behavioral indicators, potential attack methods, and the actions that may be taken when confronted by an active shooter. This one-hour symposium was developed to educate attendees on the evolution of an active shooter and trends and tactics of past events, as well as provide guidance to help you determine the best course of action for your survival and the survival of others in an active shooter situation. Our instructors offer guidance on how to prepare for and respond to an active shooter event based on DHS "Run. Hide. Fight." concept.

NJ LEARN

NJ Learn is a complete Learning Management System managed by NJOHSP at no cost to state, county, and local first responder agencies. It is available to sworn law enforcement officers and communication operators, certified emergency medical technicians and medics, and Division of Fire Safety certified firefighters. NJ Learn is web-accessible and includes standardized online training courses, a catalog registration process, a digital resource library, a notification and communications capability, and a report management system (RMS). HOSTILE VEHICLE MITIGATION

The frequency of hostile vehicle incidents is increasing due to the ease of vehicle acquisition and use, the success of past attacks, and the promotion of vehicle-ramming tactics by foreign terrorist organizations. This seminar will educate the first responder community by reviewing recent vehicle-ramming incidents and discussing tactics and strategies to mitigate and deter future attacks during large-scale special events.

NATIONAL DOMESTIC PREPAREDNESS CONSORTIUM

The National Domestic Preparedness Consortium (NDPC) is a DHS Security/FEMA training partner charged with training the nation's first responders. The NDPC is a partnership of nationally recognized organizations whose mission is to reduce the nation's vulnerability to incidents involving weapons of mass destruction, terrorism, and all-hazards high-consequence events. There is no cost for personnel to participate. Courses are delivered through three different methods:

- Online or web-based
- Direct deliveries
- Residential courses
