

ABOUT US

Created in 2012, the New Jersey Interfaith Advisory Council (IAC) is a network designed to facilitate the sharing and dissemination of information with faith-based organizations and pertinent members of their communities around New Jersey. The IAC provides a venue for government officials and members of law enforcement to maintain an open dialogue with hundreds of Christian, Muslim, Sikh, and Jewish faith-based leaders throughout New Jersey. The Council is chaired by NJOHSP Director Jared Maples.

QUICK FACTS

- There are more than 3,000 active members.
- Membership spans across all 21 New Jersey counties, with representation from nearly every major religion and sect.
- Meets on a quarterly basis with representatives from NJOHSP, New Jersey Office of the Attorney General, New Jersey State Police, FBI, and local law enforcement.
- Provides partnering agencies with feedback and insight into the needs of religious communities.
- Strengthens the goodwill between law enforcement and faith-based groups which is crucial toward keeping religious communities safe and secure in one of the most diverse states in the nation.

COMMUNITY RESOURCES

To supplement the key activities of the IAC, NJOHSP provides security resources, at no cost, and facilitates the availability of grant opportunities for nonprofit organizations in these communities to improve security and develop their own training programs.

GRANT OPPORTUNITIES

Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP)

Provides funding to organizations, as described under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, at high risk of terrorist attacks and located within designated areas of New Jersey. This federal program consists of two grant funding opportunities based upon the applicant's geographic location as described below:

NSGP-UA: Limited to nonprofit organizations located within designated areas of New Jersey (Bergen, Essex, Hudson, Hunterdon, Middlesex, Morris, Monmouth, Ocean, Passaic, Somerset, Sussex and Union Counties).

NSGP-S: Limited to nonprofit organizations located within designated areas of New Jersey (Atlantic, Burlington, Camden, Cape May, Cumberland, Gloucester, Mercer, Salem and Warren Counties).

New Jersey Nonprofit Security Grant Pilot Program (NJ NSGPP)

Provides funding to eligible nonprofit organizations across New Jersey, as described under section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, at the greatest risk of terrorist attacks. This state program consists of two grant funding opportunities as described below:

NJ NSGPP – Security Personnel (NJ NSGPP-SP): Limited to the hiring of federal, state, county or municipal active law enforcement officers appointed pursuant to P.L.1985, or security officers registered pursuant to P.L.2004, c.134, for the applicant's facility.

NJ NSGPP – Target Hardening Equipment (NJ NSGPP-THE): Limited to the purchase and installation of security equipment on property owned or leased by the nonprofit organization.
