Harold worked on several campaigns on social and environmental justice since the mid-1930s. He was present at campaigns and rallies on all of Michigan's most important environmental issues. He was there when the issue of nuclear power came up, incineration, air pollution, water quality, landfills, and the impact of globalization had on local environment protection.

Harold served in leadership roles with the Citizens for Alternatives to Chemical Contamination, Michigan Environmental Council, Detroit Audubon Society, and the Ecology Center.

Harold Stokes was the first winner of the Ecology Center's Herbert L. Munzel Award for Environmental Activism in 2004.
