Solid Waste Department Visitor Notice

(Version: June 2016)

Thank you for choosing the Marathon County Solid Waste Department for your disposal and/or recycling needs. While visiting our site we ask that you take note of these rules and be aware of the following situations.

1. No smoking.
2. High-visibility vests (provided at scale office) shall be worn at all times while on site.
3. Visitors with automobiles and 2-wheel drive light trucks are advised to use the dumpsters by the scale office.
4. Obey all traffic signs, including speed limit signs and traffic lights at scale.
5. No pets or children under the age of 16 are allowed outside of vehicles while on site.
6. It is advised that 4-wheel drive be engaged before entering the landfill working area.
7. Visitors who enter the working area of the landfill do so at their own risk and are advised of the following:
 - a. The operator on duty is in charge of the area. His/her directions and instructions shall be followed. Visitors who fail to do so may be expelled from the site and not allowed to return.
 - b. Landfill roads may have soft spots and at times can be difficult to navigate.
 - c. Sharp objects in waste material may cause damage to vehicles.
 - d. Close-toed shoes are required. No sandals or flip-flops.
8. At all times be aware of vehicle traffic including heavy-duty equipment.
 - a. Never walk behind equipment or vehicles.
 - b. Never approach equipment unless requested to do so by the operator on duty.
 - c. Do not park closer than 10 feet from the nearest vehicle.
9. When off-loading ensure vehicle is in park and is turned off.
10. Visitors using the various drop off areas (shingles, tires, appliances, etc.) must obey the posted signs and directions of the scale operator
11. No scavenging is allowed.
12. Report any injuries to any staff member. Each staff member is equipped with a 2-way radio and can arrange for additional support, if needed.
13. In the event of an emergency, follow the directions of departmental staff or first responders
14. The scale office bathroom is the storm shelter for the site.
