All of the above articles were examined for fingerprints but none were found. The above mentioned articles were forwarded to the Division on this date by Railway Express, under Waybill No. 2954.

In connection with the Colt Super .38 Automatic Pistol referred to above, it is recommended that the Division supply this type of gum to the agents in the field. It is also requested that the St.Paul office be furnished with two additional Thompson Sub-machine guns.
