In compliance with your request during Mr. Purvis' recent visit to the city, I conferred with him concerning certain/personal effects that were found on the person of John Dillinger after be was killed on the night of July 22nd. The ring in question, according to Mr. Purvis, was in the possession of Mr. Cowley. I telephonically conferred with Mr. Cowley, who stated that he turned this ring over to the Coroner at his request. The watch found on Dillinger, according to both Messrs. Purvis and Cowley, was never in their custody but it was turned over to the Coroner, as well as certain other property. With regard to the money, amounting to some seven odd dollars, the same was turned over to the Coroner as well as the keys found on Dillinger's person. Mr. Cowley stated that there were two keys - one of these keys fitting the apartment of the informant and the other key fitting a small cabinet in the in ant's home.
