Mr. Connelley called on the telephone from Oswego, Illinois to advise that our Agents have found the body of John Hamilton. He states the body is in pretty bad shape and that there is nothing much left on the bones; that the body, however, is just as was described by the confidential informant; that it is in the location on picture #5 which Connelley sent in, in the rear; that they endeavored to get the bones on the left side with a view to getting the hand, two fingers of which have been partly amputated, but were unable so to do; that apparently someone had been digging there and had dug part of it away; that the body is lying on the right side, about 2 feet under the ground; that the teeth look good and the general appearance of the teeth resembles that of Hamilton's teeth; that they found a Muse serge suit and the hat and cans just as
