and C. C. Campbell, Special agent in Charge Connelley proceeded to Jackson ville, Florida via plane, arriving late that night, and contacted the affice, for the possibility of obtaining the name of some informant who might be familiar with the locality in the vicinity of Ocala, Florida.

On Sunday the Agents proceeded to Scale, Floride, inasmich as a map had been found among the effects of Doc Barker, with a circle about the town of Ocale, and also the territory which would take in Lake Feils. Agents Compbell and Jones shocked Lake Bryant, about 10 miles sent of Gells, and Agent Brown and Special Agent in Charge Conhelley shocked Lake Weir and lake Bewers, about 10 miles south of Ocale, for various aircumstances is ted. He stated that Summers had left several days before, in his car, with a woman he was living with at this place, but was expected to return to Oklamaha on Tue sday night, January 15, 1935. He indicated that he had learned this in conversation with Blackburn, who was still at the place. He indicated that Blackburn was driving a Buick coupe,

Special Agent in Charge Connelley, together with Agent Brown, observed the place discreetly, and noted KATE BARKER and FRED BARKER, who were identified from their pictures, on the place, and thereafter made arrangements to immediately withdraw informant Durains and Agent Jones from the lake and that vicinity; and plans were made to raid the place that following morning, with the hope that Harry Compbell and the woman, evidence by Winona Burdett, would return to the place that hight. In order to in mire no one being hur should any shooting a necessary in connection with the apprehension of these parties, Agent J. McLaughlin was stationed a considerable distance west of the property in question on Highway 41, to stop the automobiles and divert them from this road, should any shooting start, and Agent T. G. Melvin was located to the east on Highway 41, beyond this property, for the same purpose. Agents C.B. Minstead, C. C. Woltz, D. G. Demphell and D. P. Sullivan pero stationed along Highway 41 at the north edge of the property, in order to cover the exit of anyone from this house to the north or east, Agents E. D. Brown and S. K. Makee being located behind a sottage to the wast of the property. to some exit of anyone through the lane in that direction, and gents J. White. R. I. Jones, A. A. Muzzay, J. L. Madela, E. M. As soon asthe firing started from within the house, Special Agent, J. C. White, who was backing up S.A.C.Connelley in his convergations with these parties from behind a tree about 53 yards from the house, immediately shot into the house with 4861 rifles 3.1.C. Connelley fell back to positive to about with a 20-06 Tifle, and at this time the parties in the house concentrated their live on the tree behind which igent white was located. Machine gun fire from the house thereafter was spread ever the side of the yard and through a little grove in which were located Agents Jones and Muzzey, who had also started firing into the house. Agents Madala and MoDada who were liberted slightly farther behind a hedge, also fired into the house, and at this time apparently the party who was then firing the machine gun from the upstairs. south-west corner of the house, spread his fire farther, so that he covered the area at a distance of about 300 yards so the west of the account with apparently such firing being at the Agents he believed to be located behind the cottage and small garages, and beyond this over their heads, his firing extending approximately to the place where agent Molaughlin was located on the highway. At this time, in order to relieve the pressure on Agent white who was behind the gree about 33 yards from the house, S.A.C. Sonneller moved into position in front of the south west corner of the house, around the small cottage, and after several shots through the front of the house, was answered by a number of machine gun bursts in that direction, and thereafter at intervals the firing continued from the house, and observation of the screens in the house later showed that they had fired from windows on all four sides of the house, apparently endeavoring to locate some of the Agents, and such fire was returned by the Agents, for a period of approximately two hours. 

the house were endeavoring to conserve their amminition, as they lengthened the periods between their fire, and reduced the number of whole in the bursts coming from the house. Apparently while firing from the east side of the bouse, these parties shot about four builts from a 35 paliber Winshamp if itle, through the house, of Mrs. A. T. Westbury, those house is located along the lane at the east side of the Carson-Bradford property, toward the late,

the party firing apparently being of the opinion that some of the agents were located at this point. During this firing Agents Migray and McDade endeavered to fire tear gas shells into the house from the week, and we ware subsecasful in getting approximately four tear gas shells into the house, Athouse and to the acrooms and mis-fire, the one shells were not placed in the appear, south west corner room. The principal firing into the house, which was soncentrated on the south west corner, where subjects finally located in the diper bedroom, was done by agent J. C. Thite with a sou rifle, agent & ... Tomes with the 30-06 wifle, Agent Muzzey with a shotgun, agent Medala with a machine gun, Agent McDade with a machine gun, and Special Agent in Charge Connelley with a 50-06 Springfield rifle. It is estimated that the Agents fixed approximately 500 rounds into the house, and that the subjects fired sut of the house about 250 rounds. Bowever, in this connection, a portion of the firing by the Agents into the house was done after the firing had ceased from within. Use of colored man

After the firing had ceased from within the house, a reasonable period of time was allowed to elapse, and after checking all of the Agents who were taking part in the raid to establish that no one had been hurt. WILLIE WOODBURY, the colored man, about 25 years of age, mho had been working on the place for Fred Barker at five dollars per week, and who was living in the small cottage at the south west corner of the property with his wife. was asked if he would call to Fred Barker, whom he knew as Mr. Blackburne and invite him out of the house if he were injured, in order that he might be taken care of, assuring him that he would not be harmed if he came out in the proper manner. Willie Woodbury agreed to go up and see if he souls talk with these parties if they were still alive, and at this time S. A. C. Connelley stood in front of the house while the colored man went around to the back door and front door, and called to these parties to come out, and also asked them if he could assist them in any way, and finding both doors locked, he then agreed to go into the house and see if the people were injured in such manner that they could not answer him, and at this time S. A. C. Connelley stood in front of the house. Woodbury entered the front door and dewent upstairs, not finding anyone downstairs, and entered the room which had been occupied by Kats Barker, He called to B.A.C. Commelley that there was no one theres. He thereafter entered the south west corner bedroom which had been the room of Fred Barker. However, on this particularnight Barker had appeal a set down so the front room and was pleaping on some with his beat at the front door, apparently to intercept anyone who might call, and this being the point apparently from which he first fired with the 38 caliber Windhester rifte. After entering the room Woodward called out to S.A. Connelley: "They are both up here". S.A.C.Connelley then asked what they were doing, and be advised that "they were both dead".

by fired from the downstairs through the window and front door with a 35 caliber Winchester wifle, and that they had fired from the windows in all four
directions from all the rooms on the second floor, there being four bedroms
in the house. Kate Barker and Fred Barker were found dead in the south-west
corner bedroom. Fred Barker was lying in the middle of the from, face floor,
with a .45 automatic under him and a machine gun with a 50 shot from beyond
his left hand, and Kate Barker was found in the gorth-east sorner of this
same room, lying on her back, with a machine gun at her left hand with a 100
shot drum on same. There was also found a 50 shot drum in the bedroom of
Kate Barker, which had evidently been completely fired; a 50 shot from in
the gun apparently used by Fred Barker was entirely smpty, and a 100 shot from on
the gun found beside Kate Barker had approximately 60 or 40 shots fired from
some.

Due to the lapse of time between the first burst of machine gun fire from the house, and the second burst, it is believed that fred Barker probably reloaded the 50 shot drum at least once. In connection with the 45. caliber automatic found under the body of Fred Barker, same was loaded with a clip containing seven bullets, and one bullet which was still in the 🖄 chamber, had been fired from same, and a shot from a 50-06 rifle had cut away part of the steel buts of this gun, causing it to jam on this one whot. and making it useless. Fred Barker, judging from the position in which he fell, was apparently facing the front of the house or the south-west window on the west side of the house, and had ten bullets from either a .551 rifle or a 30-06 rifle in his left shoulder and chest, and one wound through the back of the head, which latter wound was probably the fatal wound, and Kata Barker had three bullets in the chest, one of which apparently had gone through the heart. All of these bullets had passed completely through the bodies. The firing of these subjects was particularly close to Agents J. C. White . A. A. Muzzey and R. L. Jones, who were located in a position towards which most of the the firing by the subjects was concentrated.

The fatal shots

After the firing ceased and the bodies had been located, same were not touched until the necessary arrangements could be hade for the Coronar to view them, and shortly thereafter Sheriff from the surrounding counties appeared on the scene and offered their cooperation. Also, Mallace R. Sturgis, County Attorney, A. P. Buis, District Attorney, as well as A. P. Meedows, Prosecuting Attorney, and L. J. Futch, County Judge, who acts as Coronar, Co. arrived on the scene. Prior to the time the shooting had stopped Sheriff S.C. Thomas arrived in the vicinity, and he assisted in keeping she traffic away from highway 41, while there was any shooting going on. Mr. Futch and the Sheriff then arranged for a Coroner's jury to view the bodies and arrangements were thereafter made to take them to mundertaking parlor in Ocala, Florida, where they were prepared for burial.

The Cormer's hearing was adjourned until 11 A. Jamainy 17 1755, at which time S.A.C. Commelley appeared as a witness for the Government, and advised them of the identity of the two deceased margons, the reason for in ich they were being sought by the Division, as will as the emission record of Fred Barker; that when these persons had been divited to come out of the house on the morning of January 18, 1936, after agents had identified them selves, they had opened fire upon the agents. Thereafter the forements fury made its findings to the effect that Fred Barker and Late Barker came to their death at the hands of agents of the United States Department of investigation, in the protection of their own lives, while the said Kate Barker and Fred Barker were resising arrests.

One forwarded to the Division under date of Farmary 17, 1935.

The fingerprints of Mate and Fred Barker were obtained by Special Agent J. L. Madala and forwarded to the Division.

A Buick coupe automobile was recovered in the garage at this place, as well as certain amounts of money on the body of Fred Barker and in the purse of Kate Barker, as will hereinafter be covered in more detail by the reporting Agents. There was also found in the house at this time a number of guns, and a quantity of amunition, which will also be covered in detail by the reporting Agents who examined same, and arranged for forwarding of this equipment to the Division.

A THE PARTY OF THE
