Dear Sir:

As you know, I took the current training school to the Marine Corps Barracks at Quantico, Virginia for firearms training October 2d to 6th inclusive. All of the thirty men qualified in the use of the revolver and were given appropriate training in the use of all other Division armaments including the rifle, Colt Monitor, Thompson Submachine Gun, sawed-off shotgun, gas gun and gas masks.

The Marine Corps operated with greater efficiency in accomplishing this work than has been the case at any of the Army posts heretofore visited. I suggest that it be arranged, if possible, to have all of this work done hereafter by the Marine Corps. The grades are as follows:
