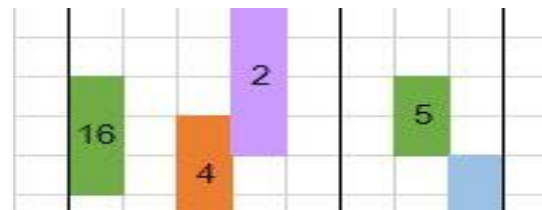


## BUILDING USE DATA COLLECTION

## OPPORTUNITIES OUTSIDE OF 9 TO 5

In collecting data for the Building Use Task Force, graphs make it quite apparent (and a surprise to no one) that most programs and groups meet between the hours of 9 and 5. Here is a list of current exceptions to that rule:

First Thursdays @ 7:00pm — Drum Circle

Nearly Every Monday @ 7:00pm — Mindfulness

Tues/Thurs @ 7:00am — Meditation

Third Thursdays @ 6:15pm — Women's Sharing\*

First Sundays @ noon — Sandwich Sunday\*

One Friday, monthly @ 5:30 — Game Night\*

Of these, those with an asterisk (\*) also include a meal. Game Night also includes childcare, and

parents wishing childcare for other events may request it if they wish to attend.

None of our working Teams meet outside of the standard work day except the Technology Team. A couple of our policy Committees, however, do. The Property Committee meets as needed in the evenings—usually around 6:00pm, when necessary. Our Finance Committee adjusted its schedule to accommodate working member Bart Renner—they meet precisely at noon until 1:00pm once a month on the third Wednesday so that Bart can come on his lunch hour.

Finally, our Board of Trustees meets monthly in the evening, usually at 6:30pm, on the fourth Tuesday of each month.

## DID YOU KNOW?

In childcare facilities, the State of North Carolina requires a minimum of 25 square feet of usable space per child. Under those guidelines, we can accommodate only five children in our Nursery space. "Higher Voluntary Program Standards" would require 30 square feet per child. UUTC is not required to be licensed —facilities that provide services for more than 4 hours a day do require licensing.

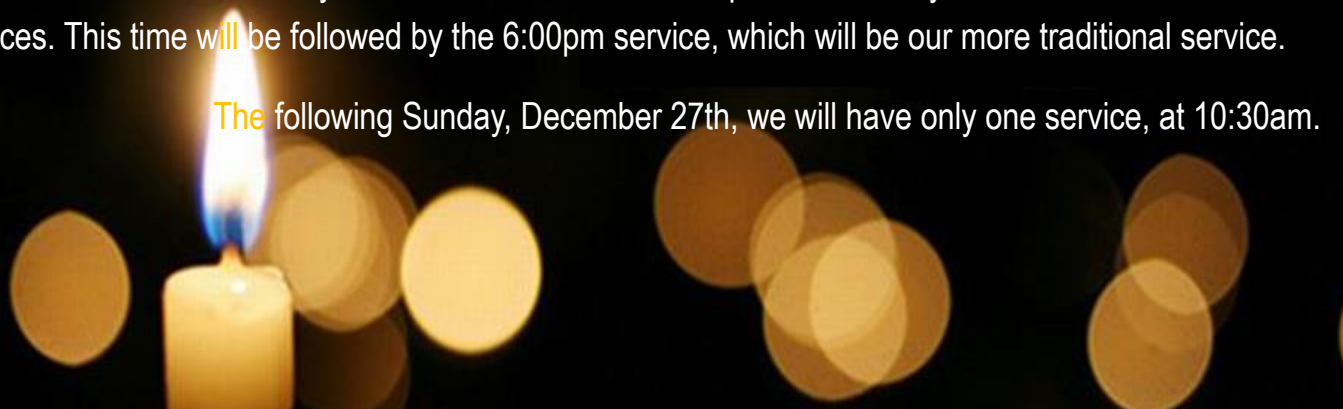
