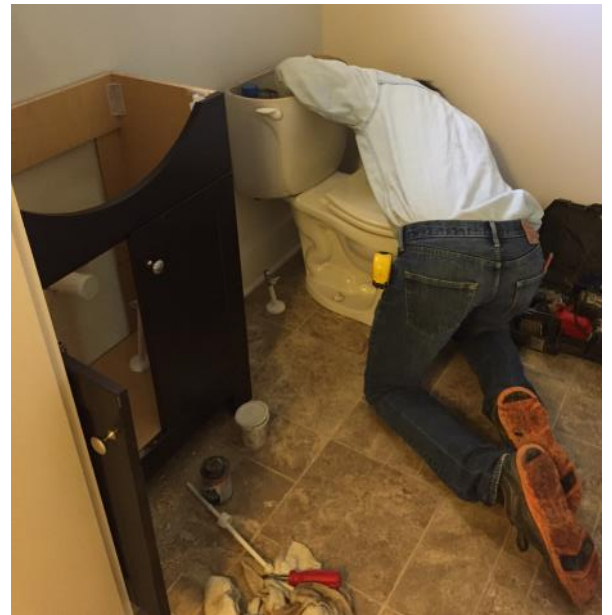


## PEOPLE POWER: ACLU RESISTANCE TRAINING

## GROWING INTO OUR SPACE

Our new cabinets were a Sponsored Project, the gift of an anonymous donor. Given the prominent location, the Aesthetics arm of the Facilities Team wanted to make sure that this installation was a warm and welcoming statement, and used that criteria in selecting this cabinetry. (They agonized over the countertop decision!) They did an outstanding job, don't you agree?

Our Sponsored Projects, which have been capital improvements outside of our Operating Budget, have been a big success in meeting some long-overdue, or just plain necessary, upgrades to our building to meet the needs of our growing congregation. If you haven't been by during the week lately, UUTC is buzzing nearly every day. Many times we have overlapping groups, which increases the demands on our operating budget through increased electricity demands and consumption of things like water and toilet paper. Everyone is coming into a safer, more useable space, now.

A number of people have contributed, over and above their pledges, to make our Sponsored Projects a reality this year. The total of all funds (cash or stock) that have gone to these improvements is \$38,374.00. We've repaired our concrete, replaced our alarm system, added insulation, upgraded our kitchen appliances, installed cabinets in the large classroom and now the foyer, replaced the flooring in our classrooms, improved the usability of our technical systems—and painted the sanctuary wall—all since July of 2016. Big thanks to all who have contributed to make these changes possible!
