Wealth event at Bowls Club



Bob Saunders, from Hampers, is a well known figure in the village. When I go to meet him, he stands behind his counter which is laden with cheese, Italian salamis and olives.

"There's nothing more challenging and enjoyable to me than to find an unknown cheese for one of my customers," he says with a bright smile.

Bob prides himself on buying and stocking as many locally sourced products as possible.

"However, the produce must be good quality. I won't buy it just because it is local." $\,$

He caught the cooking bug at a young age from his mother and from one of his uncles, who became one of his mentors.

He worked as Head Chef at The Carlton in London and at The Royal Bath, among other places.

"I was definitely inspired by my mum too, who did a lot of home cooking, so I come from a long line of chefs," he continues.

How did it all start?

Bob was born in Yeovil. His dad worked for the Great Western Railway, on steam trains, but was posted to Brighton following closure of the Yeovil branch. Bob was still a lad when the family moved.

Bob, who went to Portslade Boys School before training at Brighton Technical College, worked at Vandenburgh's in Burgess Hill for about ten years, moving up from third chef to second chef and then head chef in the late 1990s. He was then approached by his accountant to ask if he could help out Michèle Bole from

time to time in her restaurant in Hurstpierpoint – which he agreed to do.

Shortly afterwards the delicatessen next door to Michèle's restaurant came up for sale, and Bob decided to go into partnership with Michèle, running both the restaurant and delicatessen side by side.

Bob looks back on to a period of his working life which was clearly challenging: "The work load then was horrendous," he says.

"Try as hard as we could, we usually only managed to pack the restaurant at weekends, with theme nights, which was a pity! We ran Irish folk nights and jazz nights with Herbie Flowers," Bob continues. "Parking was a problem, even in those days!" Michèle decided to retire in 2005.

"Even when we closed the restaurant and I took over the sole running of the delicatessen, Hampers, I was busy enough!

"I'm lucky enough to be supported by a very competent team. Amanda has been working with me since the beginning, and both Emma and Rachel joined the team eight years ago. Sarah and of course 'B' and Denise are always on hand to help. My wife Cath, who also has another job, helps out in the evenings and at weekends and is always there to help out," says Bob.

Other than the daily running of the shop, Bob bakes his own bread each morning and cooks a hot daily special fresh soup.

Bob also runs a successful catering business. He supplies Hickstead, and can provide dishes such as

home-made coq au vin, beef stews, and soups or a buffet from 10 to 100 people.

"A few years ago, I was asked to do a cold finger buffet for a wedding being held at The Mayfair in London. It was quite nerve-racking in itself, as I had to transport all the food to the premises," he comments.

Bob, father of two grown up boys, Mark and Allan, and grandfather to Charlie, Elly and Archie, looks to the future with optimism.

"I would like to give the shop a little more space, by converting the space out back, to enable me to stock more goods," he continues with a smile.

He confesses to not having much time for hobbies, though he still has time to follow his passion - football.

"But, after all, cooking is my main hobby," he says, as he owns up to having a room full of cookery books to sample, especially old ones!

Like most of the shop owners on the High Street, he is concerned about the increase in traffic, but accepts that the High Street was built in the days of the horse and cart!

"I get a lot of pleasure meeting all customers, regular and new, old and young. I'm particularly pleased to see families enjoy my cooking and sample new products, especially home produced fare," he says.

"Hurstpierpoint has so much to offer old and newcomers: Good pubs, restaurants and lots of independent shops supplying great produce. Not forgetting St Lawrence Fair and the Hurst Festival."

Thursday 8th March - Lift to the Scaffold (PG)

Also known as Elevator to the Gallows, few debuts come punchier, cooler and more influential than Louis Malle's 1958 thriller about a Parisian murder plan unravelling scene by fateful scene. Jeanne Moreau is captivating as the woman unhappily married to a wealthy arms dealer, who hatches the perfect plan with her lover to eliminate him. The ingenuity of the plot evokes a superior episode of Columbo directed by Hitchcock. And, as if the gorgeous photography, ingeniously twisty plot and terrific performances were not enough, the film has the coolest of cool jazz score, brilliantly performed by Miles

Thurday 22nd March - NT Live Broadcast: Julius Caesar

Shakespeare's political thriller, brilliantly staged at the Bridge Theatre, starring Ben Whishaw, Michelle Fairley, David Calder and David Morrissey.

Friday 23rd March - The Big Sick (15)

Kumail is a comedian of Pakistani descent living in Chicago who meets a graduate student named Emily at one of his stand-up shows. As their relationship blossoms, he hides it from his traditional parents, who are trying to matchmake with young Pakistani women to find him a wife. When Emily suddenly succumbs to a mysterious illness that leaves her in a coma, Kumail finds himself having to deal with her deeply concerned mother and father. This may all sound quite serious, but this is one of the funniest comedies of this, or any, year.

Sunday 25th March - Their Finest (PG)

We are happy to have rescheduled this wonderful comedy drama, having had to postpone it in December. London, 1940, the British war ministry is making propaganda films to boost morale at home. Realising their films could use 'a woman's touch' they hire Catrin Cole as a scriptwriter in charge of writing the female dialogue. Gemma Arterton stands out in an all-star cast as the woman who transforms the films they are trying to make, while being looked down on and paid less because she is a woman. This film is charming, witty, moving, kind of handsome, rousing, rigorous entertainment you can't help but love.



Secondly, much needed improvements are taking place at the pavilion prior to the start of the season. We hope to upgrade the electrics, the showers, the bar and the lounge area as well as creating another dressing room. Work should take place as soon as the football season is completed.

Having completed a successful year playing friendly matches our 3rd XI are joining the league structure, meaning our 3rds will play competitive cricket for the first time. The league they join has been reorganised with a pyramid system introduced, the aim being to improve the standard across the county. It will take a season or two to settle down and there is a feeling that our 1st XI may be in a division below where perhaps we should be, but it will be interesting to see how our various teams develop in the new structure.

We are looking forward to season 2018 with confidence. We have a strong crop of juniors ready to move into senior cricket and according to junior manger Matt Parsons some are ready for the 1st XI, but they'll be introduced slowly throughout the season. The women's team will be playing more competitive cricket this season and is ready to compete with the best in the county. We'll be fielding even more junior sides this season and, speaking of juniors, our Under 13s have won the winter indoor league, having won the under 12s last year. Well done to all.

In 2007 Nicki Newson decided to take control of her own destiny. At the time she was a nurse working for the NHS, but things were tough. This is the story of how an osteopathy and complementary health clinic landed on the High Street, right where they used to sell combine harvesters!

Nicki has always loved working with people. Her career started when she qualified as a nurse and has worked at various hospitals in Sussex, including Southlands in Shoreham. She has worked in some particularly challenging departments but none more so than Intensive Care. "The High Dependency Unit," Nicki recalled, "was a place where things change so fast. Clearly some tragic events took place there, but also some amazing breakthrough moments too."

The frustrations of the National Health Service were taking their toll on Nicki however, and she began to look for a way out. Nicki explained: "I'd always had an interest in complementary health, and I'd seen an osteopath myself over many years, so I took the decision to retrain."

After deciding to retrain, Nicki moved to working in the Private sector, mainly in the High Dependency Unit at the Sussex Nuffield. It took four years full-time for her to gain a BSc degree in Osteopathy, during which time she continued to work as a nurse in HDU and latterly in Casualty in Ashford, Kent. "The course was a tough one, with evenings and holidays taken up in the student clinic from year two onwards. I graduated in 2003." It was a very difficult course, both physically and academically, but when she graduated she was awarded Best Clinician of the year.

In the early 2000s, 135-137 High Street was a retail unit for agricultural machinery supplier Harper and Eede Limited. "It may seem unbelievable to some, but there was a yard at the back (now built on) with all sorts of massive farm equipment in! The High Street was very different, even only 11 years ago," Nicki comments. Despite a lot of interest in the site in 2007, she managed to secure it for what she was planning.

The location was perfect, as she was living in Brighton at the time but was used to working around Lewes and Haywards Heath – so Nicki had plenty of contacts.

"It was always going to be a team business," she explains. "One of the key enjoyable aspects of my nursing career was being part of a team, so I was keen to work with and alongside like-minded practitioners who could all work together."

The building was completely renovated before Nicki moved in. It now consists of a shop front and reception with four treatment rooms behind. And there's a calming fragrance as soon as you open the door!

Nicki's 14-strong team now offers various treatments including osteopathy, hypnotherapy, nutrional advice, pilates, medical herbs and relationship counselling.

"We don't just treat the symptom, we look at the person as a whole."

I ask Nicki what it is that makes Sussex Ostepath and Complementary Health Clinic different?. Why don't we just go to the doctor?

"Well, for a start, we aren't a replacement for a GP. That's the first thing to note." Nicki tells me that her clinic is firmly planted as 'complementary' to traditional medicine and not 'alternative' to it. "There's a big difference," she says strongly!



"We don't just treat the symptom; that's the main difference," Nicki explains. "We look at the whole person and that takes time." Time is important to her and is one of the fundamental qualities that she wanted to be able to give to her patients. "While nursing we were always under pressure to move on. Here, I get to make the rules, and if I feel I need to see someone for longer, it's my choice!" First appointments at the clinic are always longer to allow the practitioner to ask more questions and find out all about the patient and not just what the problem is.


For instance, severe headaches may be occurring as a result of going through the menopause, or perhaps your work environment or even caring for an elderly relative. Or perhaps a phobia is present in the patient's life and is stopping them doing certain things. Hypnotherapy can be used to retrain the brain to react differently to those situations that have traditionally caused upset, stress or even pain.


"Often, as practitioners, we may choose to work together and cross-refer," Nicki explains. "Not only does that give the patient an additional route to success, but it also means we can talk together professionally about it; two heads are always better than one!"

And it is about real change for the patient, as Nicki explains: "If we don't obtain a good improvement after two or three treatments, then we would consider referring to either another practitioner or back to their GP for further investigations. The practitioners do not make wild claims of curing patients, and wherever possible there is scientific backing to our treatments as many of our practitioners come from clinical backgrounds too."

In fact Nicki's relationship with local GP surgeries, and other health professionals, is a key part of the business – through which they receive a number of referrals on a regular basis.

The clinic has had a lot of success in helping older people feel better and to lead more comfortable lives. "Some come in to us with an expectation that with





In the last two years Nicki, a lifelong dog lover, has been able to adapt her skills to help dogs feel less pain too. As a Canine Osteopath, she is able to visit the animal in their home in order to address a number of issues, including post-op rehabilitation and arthritis in older dogs.

So what of life in the High Street for Nicki and her team? "It's still a fantastic place to be," she explains, "and we always make sure drivers have plenty of big posters to read while they're sitting in traffic waiting to move to the other end!

"Our clientele is quite different from when we started, but most of our custom still comes from patients within a five mile radius of the clinic. And we still love it when they say they are feeling better than last time they saw us!"





Young bell ringers

Have you heard the bells ringing at Holy Trinity Church? Ever wondered who is behind the 'ringing of the changes'? Holy Trinity has an enthusiastic and vibrant team of bell-ringers who ring the eight bells in the tower every week. We have ringers from ages 12-80. You may be surprised to see how many young people or 'young ringers' descend on the tower on Thursday evenings and Sunday mornings. Here is an insight into the life of young ringers at Hurst...

There are about ten young ringers in our group, our youngest is Jonathan (12) and our oldest is William (17). We regularly ring together with the rest of the Hurstpierpoint band, but sometimes our ventures take us elsewhere...

How did we get into ringing and why do we ring?
Before we started ringing few of us knew each other at all. William started ringing when Hurstpierpoint tower captain John Norris and past tower captain Sue Elrick visited St Lawrence school to talk about bell-ringing and invite pupils to learn to ring and take part in the three minutes of national ringing to mark the opening of the 2012 Olympic Games. William decided that he wanted to have a go and started bell-ringing lessons at Holy Trinity. He's been a dedicated member of the band ever since.

Some young ringers come from around the local area to ring at Holy Trinity on a Thursday too. Molly (15) learnt to ring at St Cosmos and St Damian Church in Keymer but regularly goes to practice night in Hurst. This is one of the joys of ringing – in the words of young ringer Josh (16), who learnt to ring at St John the Evangelist Church in Burgess Hill: "You can ring in so many places; ringing takes you everywhere."

We all ring for many reasons. Ringing is certainly a team 'sport'. It takes time to learn the different ringing patterns or 'methods' and you really have to focus to produce good ringing or 'well struck changes'. Josephine (15), who learnt to ring at St Margaret's Church in Ditchling, said: "I really enjoy the complexity of methods and mental and physical challenge of ringing the bells well."

Where it all happens

At 7pm on a Thursday, ringers young and old meet to practice our ringing at Holy Trinity. Some nights there can be up to 20 ringers from Hurstpierpoint and the surrounding area. John Norris organises and runs the ringing. We ring some simple 'methods' and some more complicated ones as well. You will often find someone trying a new 'method' for the first time. Hurst is famous for its 'cake break' at half time, this gives a chance for the young ringers to catch up with each other and other ringers. Alex (15) says: "I really enjoy the social aspect and the people I meet through ringing."





Where has ringing taken them?

Rachel (16), another Hurstpierpoint young ringer, conducted the Sussex Youth Team at the ringing World National Youth Contest in Birmingham last year. Josh and William were also in this team. We competed against teams from all over the country and came third overall. We often go on ringing outings together, visiting places like Portsmouth, London and Oxford. Rachel and Josh recently travelled to Bristol after being offered the opportunity to ring on the Grand Ring of 12 at St Mary Redcliffe. Rachel said: "The places ringing takes you is extraordinary, but it all started for me in Hurstpierpoint."

Recently we have started ringing quarter peals together. A quarter peal is 1,260 changes rung without a break and usually takes around 45 minutes (but we like to 'get them round' in 40!). They are great fun and require focus (one of our number, who shall be nameless, often has to be reminded to 'dodge', which is a change of a bell's 'coursing' position, in a method). A whole band of young ringers ringing a quarter peal isn't that common, and our performances don't go unnoticed across Sussex.



Fragile Things by Neil Gaiman

BOOK REVIEW

Fragile Things is a collection of 'short fictions and wonders' by Neil Gaiman, which appeared on a list of mood-boosting books in 2016. The books on the list were chosen by readers for their uplifting and mood boosting qualities, but don't be fooled into thinking that the pieces in this collection are lightweight - some verge on scary - but all are worth reading.

March is Wellbeing Month in West Sussex Libraries and according to research conducted by the Reading Agency 'there is strong evidence that reading for pleasure can increase empathy, improve relationships with others, reduce the symptoms of depression and improve well-being throughout life'.

This is a great book to dip into, some of the pieces are very short, and as little as 15 minutes of reading a day can give you all of those beneficial effects. My favourite piece is 'Instructions', a poem that works as well in prose as it does in picture book format for children.

Ingredients

1 large orange 50g raisins 2 fresh figs cut into cubes 4 tablespoons Golden Syrup 200g salted butter 60g Muscovado sugar

30g linseeds
250g jumbo oats
90g plain flour
70g walnuts – smashed into small pieces
Need – baking tin (23cm square is best), baking parchment, larger
size grater, 2 saucepans, citrus juicer, wooden spoon, mixing bowl

This is a family favourite and wonderful for days spent cooking with the kids. So important to invest time in encouraging kids to cook, to blend and to play with flavours in order to keep them interested in food and comfortable in the kitchen.





Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 160C/Gas Mark 3. Grease baking tin and line with parchment.
- 2. Grate zest from orange before juicing. Set aside.
- Squeeze juice from orange and add to first pan. Put raisins in pan and bring to a boil then turn off the heat. Cover pan and leave for raisins to plump up whilst you move to Part 4.
- 4. In the second pan, measure 4 spoons of golden syrup. Add butter, brown sugar and orange zest. Heat gently until butter has completely melted. Turn off heat.
- 5. In a large bowl combine the oats, flour, linseed and walnuts. Mix well. Stir in butter mixture and raisins plus the chopped figs. Stir all the ingredients well so oats are fully coated with the gooey mixture – we love this bit as the golden syrup, butter and oats merge into sticky loveliness.

- 6. Spread mixture into the lined tin. Press flat. Place tin in oven for 20-25 minutes or until golden brown.
- 7. When removing the tin, the flapjack can be lifted out of the tin using the parchment. Leave to cool for a minimum of 15 minutes before cutting. Cut into 16 chunks. Works well served with strawberries, walnuts and fresh figs. Try your first one when still slightly warm.


