Dear Friends:

Welcome to Trinity Episcopal Church! Today in our worship we celebrate one of the principal feasts of the church – All Saints’ Day. We are delighted also to have the joy of celebrating the sacrament of Holy Baptism.

Each year on November 1st or the first Sunday following, the Episcopal Church celebrates All Saints’ Day. In the New Testament the word “saints” is used to describe the entire membership of the Christian community. So All Saints’ Day includes all deceased Christians – all “the faithful departed”. It is a day of triumphant joy. Some think of it as a “Christian Memorial Day”. As we render thanks to God for the lives and deaths of the saints we recognize the common bond between the church on earth and the church triumphant in God’s love. Names of the faithful departed are read as part of the All Saints’ Day liturgy. The liturgical color white reminds us that we are Easter people, people of the Resurrection. We rejoice today in the “great cloud of witnesses” who have walked the way of faith before us, and now surround us and join us in our praise of God. (Hebrews 12:1).

It is also our privilege today to share the joy of baptizing Jonathan Ernest Angle and welcoming him as the newest member of the worldwide Body of Christ. Baptized with water in the name of the Holy Trinity and anointed with oil, Jonathan will be marked as Christ’s own forever and forever his life will be changed. Welcoming and accepting God’s grace into one’s life is the gift received through Christ in baptism.

In the Episcopal Church, we believe that we are made from and for goodness, and are called to share God’s goodness and love with others. Our commitment to do so is outlined in our baptismal promises, summarized as follows: to care about our relationship with God through prayer, worship, and study; to care about our relationship with others by seeking to find goodness and showing goodness to all people; to strive to help bring in God’s kingdom of justice and peace, and by resisting all evil in our world. Baptism commits our lives to this purpose.

We cannot do this alone. Baptism acknowledges our need for the help of God’s grace and the support of our church community to live out these vows, made by us or made on our behalf.

While we as Episcopalians believe God is present in all moments, baptism is a sacrament, as is the Holy Eucharist, wherein we acknowledge the very presence of God (inward grace) through the outward signs of water and oil.

It is our prayer that all present here will experience God’s goodness and grace in this time of worship. Please join us again, and consider making Trinity your church home for spiritual support, nurture, and service to the world.

THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

The Celebrant blesses the water, first saying

The Lord be with you.

People **And also with you.**

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People **It is right to give God thanks and praise.**

Celebrant

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

THE BAPTISM

The candidate is presented by name to the Celebrant who then pours water upon him for baptism, saying

Jonathan Ernest, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Celebrant Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain him, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

Then the Celebrant places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross and saying to him

Jonathan Ernest, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen.**

Then the Deacon hands a lighted candle to the newly baptized saying

Jonathan Ernest, receive the light of Christ so your light might shine among all people to the glory of God.

The Celebrant then says

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

Celebrant and People

We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

THE PEACE

Celebrant The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People And also with you.

The Ministers and People greet one another in the name of Christ.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *AMEN.*
