GREAT NEWS FOR HORESOWNERS THE FARRIER LABOR IS FREE

CONSTRUCTION HAS BEGUN ON THE B.W.F.A.'S RESEARCH & TESTING LABORATORY. A group of fifty B.W.F.A. farriers have combined their efforts and have raised the necessary funds to build the first B.W.F.A. Farrier Research Laboratory. Construction began on December 20, 1991 with plans to be open by June 1, 1992 with a Grand Opening in September 1992.

This lab will be operated by experienced working farrier members of the B.W.F.A. but will allow NEW upcoming farriers to become active participants in the on-going studies.

No longer will we have to depend on hearsay or the opinion from only one individual when it comes to using farrier products, equipment and new techniques related to shoeing horses. Products will be used and tested on an individual basis and the immediate and long term results will be professionally tabulated and computed, then passed along to the See Page 2

We are continuing to track the results and will soon try out another glue-on material as soon as it arrives. We have experimented and documented 5 or more years using glue on Anvil Brand aluminum shoes in teaching and introducing it to farriers. 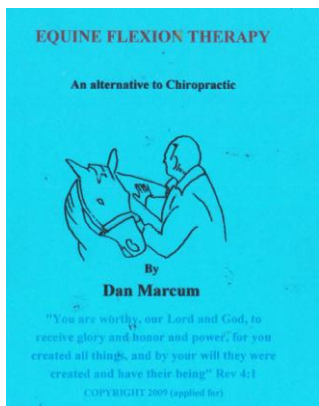

FAQ section (Frequently Asked Questions)

Certification upgrading is automatic every year by paying annual dues.

An unfortunate misunderstanding by some, but this has never been the option. This has never been in print to lead someone to this conclusion. The original goal was to provide continuing education to test in order to upgrade.

By continuing to pay your annual dues, you remain a Current Member and only when you submit your annual dues. If your dues lapse for several years, you can re-join at the same level and start back paying your dues with a new membership of the date of your payment. Sorry....we cannot back date because it would look to others like you actually paid your dues when you did not and others did.

The Lifetime option has always been available and with just one payment, you will never pay dues again. Upon upgrading during your lifetime, you are asked to pay an upgrade fee each time and now a testing fee when you upgrade to another certification level. The advantage of continuing your membership dues and upgrading is to reach that level of Master Farrier in only 7 years....whether than 15 years. Those coming in and testing for the Master Level at one time are required to have 15 years of experience and two forms of referral. The 3 day testing is the same no matter how you enter by 3 BWFA Master Farrier TESTERS to ensure a fair testing.

If someone automatically acquires a Gold Lifetime status upon the age of 65, that GOLD status will entitle him to lifetime membership at that point, not automatic Master Farrier status. The person will remain the same certification level they were when they turned 65, just no longer pay dues, which is our way of honoring their career.

These guidelines were designed by the original BWFA Master Educator School Owners along with advice from working Master Farriers, Professionals, who worked tirelessly together back in the 1980's to form a new type of certification program, a little friendlier and "working" related rather than contest related. Two years and two conventions with hundreds of farriers offering their input helped design it.

The Tale of the Boy and Dog

Back a long time ago when I was still riding the rodeo circuit and just starting out shoeing horses. I was driving to a drop to shoe a few horses for a rodeo rider who was as tough as any that I have known. He was not going to be there, but his young son was who was about 8 years old would be. I knew he would have his dog with him. Now, Rodeo people are country people and when they have a dog it's not like city people. Their dog had a reason to be there. It worked the cattle, did what it was told, and helped the family do its day to day chores. City dogs are mostly just pets. Country people have no need for pets. They just cost them money and do nothing to help make a living.

I had a young 16 year old boy, who would one day become a real fine horseshoer himself coming down the road to this man's ranch with me. He was coming along to learn a little of the trade. His Mom had worked with dogs, so he knew all about dogs too. So to be on the safe side before we got there I told him, "Don't play with the kid and if his dog was there don't play with the dog". He just looked at me and said why? And I told him that they are not like the dogs he has, and that the kid plays as hard as he works, so don't get them started on something that you can't finish. Well, I thought I had it all covered, so I pull up to the barn and there was the 8 year old and his dog. As we got out I told the 16 year old "Now, remember what I said."

I got about half way done with the horses, and the 16 year old forgot what I said all together, and started playing with the kid and dog. Now at first it was all going just fine. The 16 year old even stopped for a moment and gave me a look as if to say, "See, I know what I am doing." Then somewhere along the way it started to get a little rough and the 8 year old picked up a can of spray paint and was going to spray the 16 year old. That is when the 16 year old started to act his age and took the can away from the 8 year old. The 8 year old demanded his can back, or else. The 16 year old said, "Or else what?" Well, that little 8 year old just looked down at his dog and said, "Sick him." Now, that 16 year old was tall, long legged, and was running really fast around and around my truck. 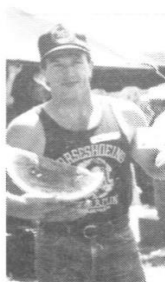

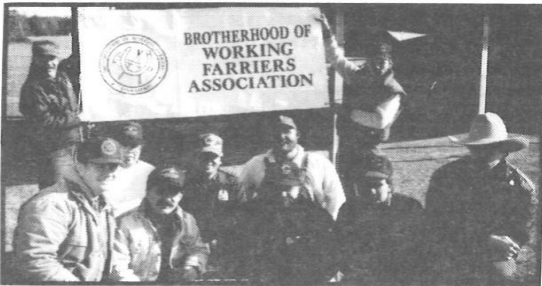

THE GRANDFATHER CLAUSE

What is it and who does it effect?

The grandfather clause will remain open until December 31, 1992 to allow farriers to enter into the certification program at the levels of Journeyman I and II and Master Farrier levels without formal testing. The guidelines under this Grandfather Clause are available by writing or calling the B.W.F.A. Headquarters.

Granted that all schools in the United States can always stand a little improvement, but let's face the truth, all the public schools, private and colleges need improvements. But here again, is there a school from any country, anywhere, that couldn't use some improvements? In essence, nothing is perfect.

It always comes down to having enough revenue when it comes to operating any type of teaching institution. So before, you folks from other countries and people within this country start wacking the procedures and requirements of operating a school, get your facts straight. You are going to find that the guidelines for operating any school are much more strict than you ever thought.

FROM THE MASTER EDUCATORS

In giving certification tests it is always difficult to come up with fair procedures when there is not only a written test but practical test involved. What makes it so difficult is that each horse is different or can pose a different situation and way of shoeing.

The B.W.F.A. and the Master Educators works hard to provide fair and simple testing procedures for the one taking the test but yet puts more pressure on the one giving the test (the TESTER). For example: if the TESTER is offering a test where hand-made shoes are to be made, not only is he required to make the shoe himself in the presence of the one taking the test, but his shoe is also judged right along with the person taking the test.

We are not trying to make our tests harder but MORE FAIR. At our most recent Master Farrier Certification Test Clinic, a TESTER was making his shoe and developed a flaw and was allowed to start over. Therefore, the person taking the test was allowed the same advantage. Our belief was that if the TESTER had to feel some of the pressure of being tested in front of others, then he would be inclined to be more fair and not ask an impossible task from the individual taking the test.

I speak on behalf of the Master Educators, that we believe this procedure eases the tension of taking the test and offers a better atmosphere. The proof is in the results!

Farrier certification can be obtained on a personal level, one on one with a B.W.F.A. TESTER and at Master Educator Schools. These are listed in our printed information package and can be yours upon request by letter to the B.W.F.A. Headquarters.

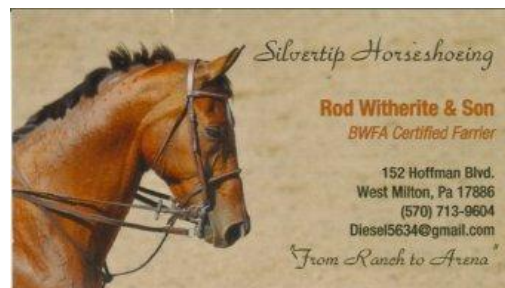
