## PROGRAM + GALLERY INVESTIGATION SHEETS + PERFORMANCE

Designed to align with State Standards, our guided packages provide active, hands-on learning for students of all ages. Whether handling reproduction artifacts in our museum classroom, utilizing custom designed investigation guides in the museum galleries, or chatting with an actor after a live performance – your students will be actively engaged throughout their visit!

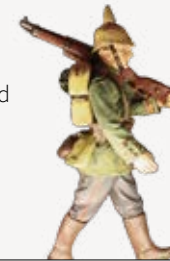
- Create a large 3D map of Louisville’s neighborhoods adding miniature figures, landmarks and architecture to the display

## LEWIS AND CLARK: AN AMERICAN ADVENTURE

Get ready for an adventure! Re-trace the two-year journey of the Corps of Discovery and learn about the local connections to their historic trek west across America. The program includes:

- Exploration of the hands-on and immersive *Lewis and Clark Experience* exhibit
- K - 3rd grade students enjoy a centers-based class session where they choose from a selection of hands-on crafts and activities
- 4th – 12th grade students focus their time on an exhibit investigation examining landforms, animal species, transportation, technology and cultures
- All age groups finish up the day with a live show performed by the Frazier’s talented actor/educators

## NUTCRACKER THE EXHIBITION: 60 YEARS OF MAGIC AND MAJESTY

Available November 9, 2017 through January 7, 2018

Join us this winter to experience *Nutcracker the Exhibition: 60 Years of Magic and Majesty!* This beautiful exhibit celebrates the Louisville Ballet's *Nutcracker*, a beloved holiday tradition in the Louisville community for over six decades. Students will:

- Explore original costumes, stage models, set recreations, photographs, and other artifacts from *Nutcracker* performances past and present, as well as interactive activities that demonstrate the history and magic of this enchanting ballet
- Discover winter traditions from around the world with the Frazier's Holiday Hunt investigation sheets, including a world map to locate countries encountered at the museum
- Enjoy self-guided exploration of the museum galleries, including access to the Lewis and Clark Experience Exhibit and the Charles Stewart Toy Soldier Collection
- View a holiday-themed performance or storytelling shared by one of the Frazier's talented actor/educators

Want to make a day of it? On December 12-15 you can opt to add a matinee viewing of *The Brown-Forman Nutcracker (Act 1)* performed by the Louisville Ballet just a short walk away at the KY Center for the Arts. Groups may choose from a 9:00 – 12:00 experience (no time for lunch) or 10:45 – 2:00 experience (school brings sack lunches to eat at the Frazier). Add \$10 per student to your cost; each site will be paid separately.

- A live performance about life on the Kentucky frontier

## BROTHER AGAINST BROTHER: KENTUCKY DURING THE CIVIL WAR

Available Tuesday through Friday

During this unique, drama-infused program, students gain an understanding of the important role that KY played during the American Civil War and learn about the daily life of a Civil War soldier. Students will:

- Participate in a 45-minute, interactive performance by an actor portraying both a Union and Confederate soldier from Kentucky
- Take part in the action by learning marching drills, bandaging a wounded soldier and handling objects from a Civil War haversack
- Complete an investigation guide in the museum galleries, exploring 19th century primary source images and artifacts in meaningful ways

## PROHIBITION: PROGRESSIVISM, THE ROARING TWENTIES AND BEYOND

Available now through December, 2017

Was Prohibition a noble experiment or a terrible mistake? Students consider this question as they:

- Examine the Progressive Movement including the call to eliminate corruption in government, outlaw “intoxicating beverages,” and provide women the right to vote
- Complete investigation sheets in the museum’s temporary exhibit *Spirits of the Bluegrass: Prohibition and Kentucky* exploring the culture of the roaring 20’s and the impacts of the 18th amendment
- Enjoy self-guided time to explore other museum exhibits
- View a 1920’s-themed live performance by one of the Frazier Museum’s talented actor/educators

- Re-imagine the taxes and acts that so infuriated many of the colonists, and led to the American Revolution, as modern-day scenarios
- Act out the situations, make connections and draw conclusions about this tumultuous time in our history
- Work on gallery investigation guides to explore the theme of independence throughout American history
- View a Revolutionary War-themed live performance by one of our talented actor/educators

## DISCOVERING THE MIDDLE AGES

Is it fair to identify the Middle Ages as the "Dark Ages" or is the time period just getting a bad rap? Let your students make the call as they:

- Become detectives and examine hands-on "evidence" related to the time period
- Take a careful look at arguments for/against the label "Dark Ages" and discuss their opinions, using evidence to support their point of view
- Complete a gallery investigation guide that draws comparisons between American history and the Middle Ages (please note that our galleries no longer contain medieval artifacts)
- Enjoy a medieval-themed performance by one of the Frazier's talented actor/educators

### Add a Hands-On Activity Kit

**We have taken our most popular outreach programs and made them even better!**

Ask about adding a hands-on activity kit filled with **learning objects will be shipped to your school prior to the scheduled performance.** Using guided inquiry sheets, your students will exercise their observational skills and make predictions about the objects. On the day of the performance, the actor will incorporate the objects and related discussion into the program. ## PAYMENT INFORMATION

- To qualify for the education group rate, payment for students and chaperones should be collected in advance and presented to Admissions Desk in one lump sum
- Payment can be made by cash, check or credit card.
- Payment is expected to be made on the day of your visit. If your group needs to be invoiced, please alert staff before your arrival
- Unless otherwise noted, groups will be charged based on the number of students present on the day of the visit.
- Groups that do not meet the minimum requirement of 15 students have the option of paying for 15 at the education rate in order to experience the program.
- Groups will be reimbursed for overpayment only if their check is \$15.00 or more above the actual cost of the visit.

## LUNCH ROOM RENTAL

An indoor space to eat sack lunches can be reserved for an additional \$0.50 cents per person. Availability is limited / advance reservations are required.
