Sewing Machine

Bring your own machine or rent one from the shop (reserve when registering for the class).

Bring power cord, foot pedal, and manual (you never know!), if using your own machine

Tools of the Trade

Carry everything you need in these sturdy organizers. The front zips open for easy access to rulers, cutting mats, sketchbooks, tools, and supplies. The small portfolio holds a $12" \times 18"$ mat; the large holds an $18" \times 24"$ mat.

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PRE CLASS INSTRUCTIONS

<u>Before Class</u> Allow adequate time to do these steps, do not try to accomplish this the night before class.

If you need quilting done for this project, contact Ellen at the shop to schedule. She needs a small amount of extra fabric to quilt on the long arm, so check with her before purchasing fabric.

- 1) Cut main fabric pieces, lining pieces, Soft and Stable, fusible interfacing (SF101) and coordinating fabric pieces. Quilt the pieces as listed on page 2 and 3.
- 2) Cut the quilted fabric pieces and seal the edges as directed. Or you can use a narrow zigzag stitch or serge the edges (Page 3)
- 3) Label all the pieces. Labels can be found on page 20 or 21 depending on which size you are making.
- 4) Prepare bias binding. (Page 3)
- 5) Fuse pieces as directed on page 3 (in the gray box) and continues on page 4
- 6) Prepare the strap and handles; instructions are on pages 4.
- 7) Added note: I use Bondic to seal the ends of zippers. This product is a glue and hardens with an UV light in 4 seconds. It can also be used to mend all kinds of plastics, etc. This can be purchased from Amazon, Walmart etc. This is optional but saves me a lot of stitching time when it comes to sealing the end of zippers! I will demo this in class.
