Morning Classes

PFC100 BASIC ADULT MINISTRY TRAINING

Required for all adult ministry volunteers.

[3 hours] This introduction to jail and prison ministry is for new or potential volunteers. You will learn about the PFC vision, mission and strategy, the Biblical basis for prison ministry, inmate statistics, overview of the Washington State Corrections System, and how to best partner with the institutions for maximum effectiveness.

PFC130 BIBLE STUDY REVIEWER TRAINING

Required for all Bible Study School volunteers.

[3 hours] This course describes the PFC National Bible Study Program, a correspondence course complete with over 100 individual Bible studies. Includes how to review the studies, how to write encouraging comments, the goals of the program, and how to deal with inmate requests and difficult issues.

PFC320 UNDERSTANDING ADDICTIONS

Recommended for anyone who interacts with current or recovering addicts.

[3 hours] This course offers a basic understanding of addictive tendencies, the causes of addictions, appropriate and inappropriate behavior when dealing with the addict, and offers a framework for overcoming addictions.

PFC390 THE HOLY SPIRIT

Recommended for all PFC volunteers.

[3 hours] Comforter. Teacher. Intercessor. This course studies several different denominational teachings regarding the Holy Spirit, including the Pentecostal viewpoint on the Baptism of the Holy Spirit and the 9 gifts of the Spirit as taught by Paul in 1 Corinthians chapters 12 and 14.

Lunch & Learn Classes

Lunch & Learn classes will be held during the one-hour lunch break, so please bring your own lunch or pre-order a lunch from us by returning the enclosed lunch order form with a \$10 check.

PFC160 UNDERSTANDING INMATE MANIPULATION

Recommended for all PFC volunteers.

[1 hour] This course provides a straight-forward look at the reality of inmate manipulation. Although PFC volunteers have tender hearts toward inmates, it is important that all volunteers understand that not every inmate has a sincere motivation to change and live for Jesus. This course will help you recognize when that is the case.

PFC250 CONDUCTING POWERFUL ALTAR CALLS

Recommended for all in-prison volunteers.

[1 hour] This class is intended to provide the volunteer with the best current practices for effective altar calls. All PFC Group Leaders & Asst. Group Leaders are encouraged to attend this brief session. This presentation seeks to establish a standardized process when inviting inmates to receive Christ.

PFC260 SHORT TERM INTERNATIONAL PRISON MISSION TRIPS

Recommended for all PFC volunteers.

[1 hour] This course provides the participants with an understanding of what it is like to take a short term mission trip specifically targeted to the prisons of third world countries. Participants will learn the 5 Ministry Objectives, how to raise support, 2017 targeted regions, and more.

PFC340 BEGINNING A WRITING MINISTRY

Recommended for anyone gifted in writing.

[1 hour] Paul, Peter, James, Jude, and John all wrote letters to individuals and churches. Writing can be a lasting legacy for any Christian. This class is intended to provide practical tools to be effective in writing; be it in messages, sermons, letters, and more.

Afternoon Classes

PFC120 EFFECTIVE MUSIC & DRAMA PRISON MINISTRY

Required for all M & D ministry volunteers.

[3 hours] This course will provide an introduction and overview of the PFC Creative Arts Ministry, and equip volunteers to effectively serve the Lord behind bars through music and/or drama.

PFC200 GROUP LEADER TRAINING

Prerequisite: PFC 100 or PFC 110

Required for Group Leaders and Group Leader candidates.

[3 hours] This leadership class defines the "franchise" concept of team ministry. It covers roles and responsibilities of the Group Leader, the PFC office, elements of the chapel service, and fundamentals of leadership.

PFC335 UNDERSTANDING GOD'S CALL IN CHRISTIAN SERVICE

Recommended for anyone who feels called to Christian ministry.

[3 hours] Often someone will say, "I'm called to be an evangelist," or "God has called me to teach." Are there Biblical standards for recognizing a calling? Are there different levels? How is this judged? This course answers those questions and many more.

PFC370 SPIRITUAL WARFARE

Recommended for all PFC volunteers.

[3 hours] This course focuses on the very real issue of spiritual warfare as it applies inside the jails and prisons. Scripturally-based teaching equips the volunteer to understand the enemy and how to discern spiritual attacks. Learn how to use God's Word and the power of the Holy Spirit to overcome and be victorious in any situation.



All-Day Class

PFC110 BASIC JUVENILE MINISTRY TRAINING

Required for all juvenile ministry volunteers.

[7 hours] For new or potential youth volunteers, this class describes the PFC vision, mission, and strategy for ministry, an overview of the juvenile detention system in Washington, and the PFC Volunteer Code of Conduct. This class also covers the basics in understanding the juvenile offender mindset, effective communication with youth, and effective evangelism techniques. *(You will have a one-hour lunch break, so please consider registering for one of the Lunch and Learn Classes.)*
