

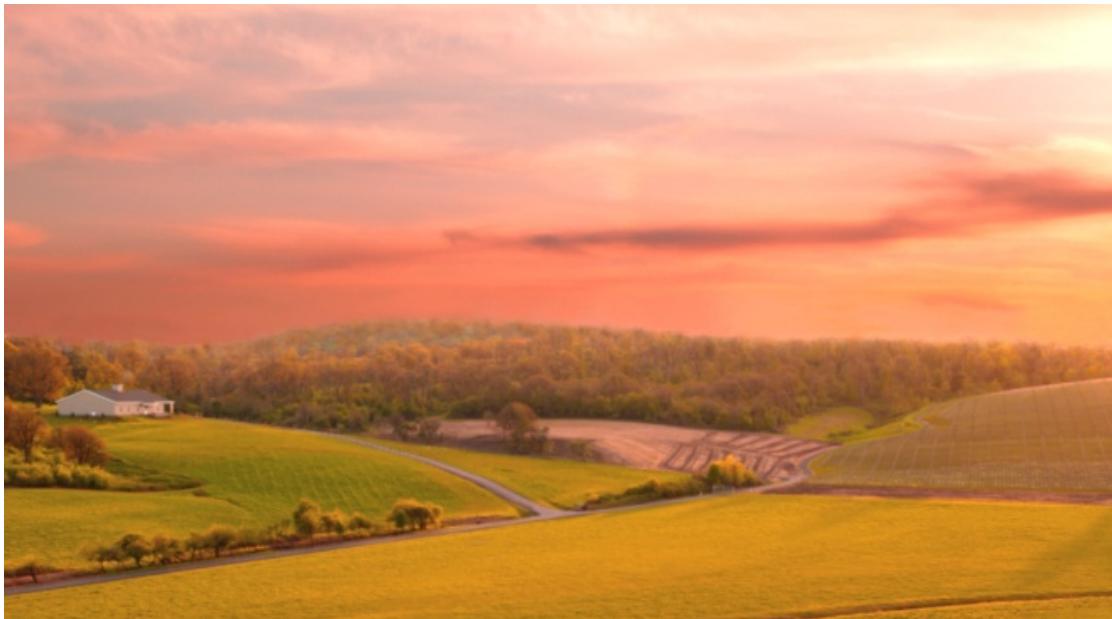


Winery Overview:

Left Coast Cellars is one of the Willamette Valley's rising stars. A bucolic parcel of land purchased in 2003, by founders Suzanne and Robert Pfaff, today represents a remarkable transformation guided by a unified vision devoted to sustainability of the land and the production, with care and patience, of wines of the highest quality that intrinsically reflect their unique terroirs.

Serendipity led Viticulturist and General Manager, Luke McCollum, from highly visible positions in Napa Valley to Oregon, where he was offered the opportunity to develop and expand a wine estate from the ground up. Together, Luke and the Pfaff family over the last 12 years have sculpted rolling Oregon countryside into one of the Willamette Valley's most beautiful wineries, aided by Winemaker, Joe Wright who joined the Left Coast Cellars team in 2011.

With an eye toward building a lasting and enduring legacy for generations to come, growth is still on the Pfaff family's horizon. There is no doubt that Left Coast Cellars will continue to evolve into an emblematic winery for premium, estate-grown Willamette Valley Pinot Noir, Pinot Gris, and Chardonnay.



Estate Vineyard:

Left Coast Cellars Estate is one of the largest contiguous vineyards in the Willamette Valley, spanning 350 acres, with approximately 150 acres under vine including Pinot Noir (61%), Pinot Gris, Chardonnay, Pinot Blanc, Pinot Meunier, Syrah, and Viognier. The vineyard is divided into eight unique microclimates, each with its own set of characteristics based on soil type, exposure and elevation ranging from 225ft to 510ft above sea level. There is not one *terroir* at Left Coast Cellars but many, allowing our wines to show multiple personalities of Willamette Valley wines, bound together through the thoughtful work of Luke McCollum in the vineyard and Joe Wright in the cellar. Left Coast Cellars is known for its cooler micro-climate, owing to its location at the head of the Van Duzer Corridor, an east-west valley that creates a break in the coast range of mountains that shields most of the Willamette Valley from the Pacific Ocean. This break allows cool marine breezes and ample fog to penetrate deeply into our part of the Willamette Valley, whereas in other parts of the Willamette Valley, this is not the case. Being in the Van Duzer Corridor helps preserve natural acidity, and adds vibrancy and freshness to all Left Coast Cellars wines. Our soil composition is mostly marine sediment, with some broken volcanic soils at the higher elevations and some alluvial wash from the Missoula Floods, including giant erratic boulders, unique to Left Coast Cellars.

Wine Making and Winery Design:

Winemaker Joe Wright, formerly of Belle Vallee and Willamette Valley Vineyards, works in lockstep with Luke McCollum to insure that each vineyard block is vinified to maximize its potential. Varying lots are fermented in open top oak vats, or stainless steel, as the grapes and vintage dictate. After fermentation, individual lots of wine are aged in French oak barrels of varying toast and cooperage. The winemaking team continues to experiment with different barrels and coopers to create as much harmony as possible between oak and vineyard, and 30% of new barrels are purchased at Left Coast Cellars each year to support the winery's aging program. Exceedingly rare and experimental lots are fermented and finished in the winery's two concrete eggs, as well as in 500L French Puncheon barrels.

Left Coast Cellars Estate is LIVE (Low Impact Viticulture and Enology) and Salmon Safe certified, and participates in the groundbreaking program "Salud" that guarantees basic healthcare to seasonal field workers. The winery and vineyard are 90% solar powered, constituting the 2nd largest agricultural solar grant in Oregon. This solar power runs our water irrigation program, which includes a natural rain pond, and catchment ponds at higher elevation that can feed the irrigation systems solely by the use of gravity with minimal pumping.



Founding winemaker, viticulturist, and general manager Luke McCollom was been with Left Coast since the very beginning. Luke started started working in the wine industry at the age of 15, polishing vintage cars, picking grapes and working the bottling line. He graduated from California Polytechnic University at San Luis Obispo with a B.S in Fruit Science and a minor in Wine and Viticulture. After college, Luke managed vineyards for Napa Valley's Harlan Estate and Meridian Vineyards in Paso Robles. Luke came to Oregon in 2003 with a dream of producing hand crafted Pinot Noir and was instrumental in building Left Coast Cellars into the world class operation it is today. Luke has a hand in all aspects of Left Coast Cellars from managing the 150 acres of vineyards to diagnosing tractor repairs.



Joe Wright joined Left Coast Cellars in 2011. He was drawn to the diversity of Left Coast Cellar's 356 acre estate and is now devoted to carefully producing exclusively estate-grown wines that reflect the special characters of their sites.

Joe joined the Orgeon wine industry in 1996 after leaving Aspen, Colorado, where he managed a fine wine store for serval years. Arriving in Oregon, Joe landed a 'cellar rat' position at Willamette Valley Vineyards, eventually becoming Assistant Winemaker from 2000 to 2002. In 2002, Joe started his own winery, Belle Vallle Cellars and spent the next nine years producing and blending Pinot Noir from several of Oregon's premier vineyards. He was thrilled to join Left Coast Cellars where he could soley focus on permium estate grown Willamette Valley Pinot Noir. Joe Wright's winemaking talent has grown immensely over the years and his success can be measure in the impressive number of awards and ratings he has achieved for Left Coast Cellars wines.
