No really, they are. They're nice. But sometimes they get in the way of life. In my first story, Stephanie just wanted a fun hobby as a fairly newlywed couple. I made a doctoral dissertation on the perfect tank. In the second story, I was so intent on our plans that a detour sent me into 'grumpy dad' mode.

I am not in control. You aren't either. Plans are great when we realize this, and we try to live our lives pleasing to God and loving each other. Few, very few, plans are worth being distracted from loving people. None are worth being distracted from God.

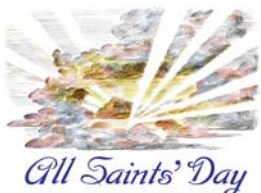

Youth Chorale and Chamber Singers

The Fort Wayne Children's Choir (FWCC) offers a program which strongly emphasizes developing music literacy and appreciation through choral literature. The choir is organized into a tiered-program with a specific music curriculum for each level. Auditioned singers are placed in an ensemble based on their musical skill, growth and development.



Youth Chorale

The Youth Chorale was created out of a necessity to allow older students to continue to sing with the organization and to allow older students who have not yet had a chance to learn music literacy skills a place to sing. Members of this choir are typically high school students. Advanced skills in vocal technique, sight-reading, and music theory are stressed. Mixed voice literature (SAB, SATB) is used. They rehearse weekly throughout the school year for 90 minutes.

Chamber Singers

A recent addition to the FWCC choir program, the Chamber Singers is made up of select members of the Youth Chorale. This highly motivated ensemble performs for small venues and private functions throughout the community. They rehearse weekly throughout the school year for 60 minutes.



The concert will pull on repertoire from the past summer as well as new titles from the fall. The summer had medleys of Broadway shows, traditional sacred music, and jazz standards. New music this fall focuses on great texts; everything from great poetry to sacred.

All Rodeheaver Series performances are offered free of charge and the public is cordially invited to attend. Support for the series, established in 1990, comes from donations made by attendees and interested patrons. We thank our subscribers for their generous support through the years.

One Committee Structure: FUMC has discussed a one committee structure in the past. Pastor Mark requested permission to form a task-force to create a "One Administrative Committee Structure" as well as a timeline of implementation. 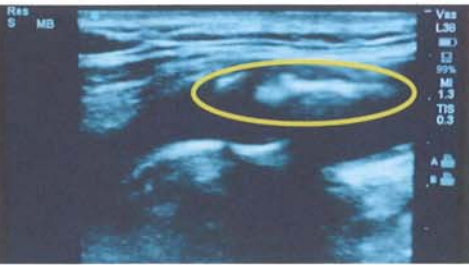

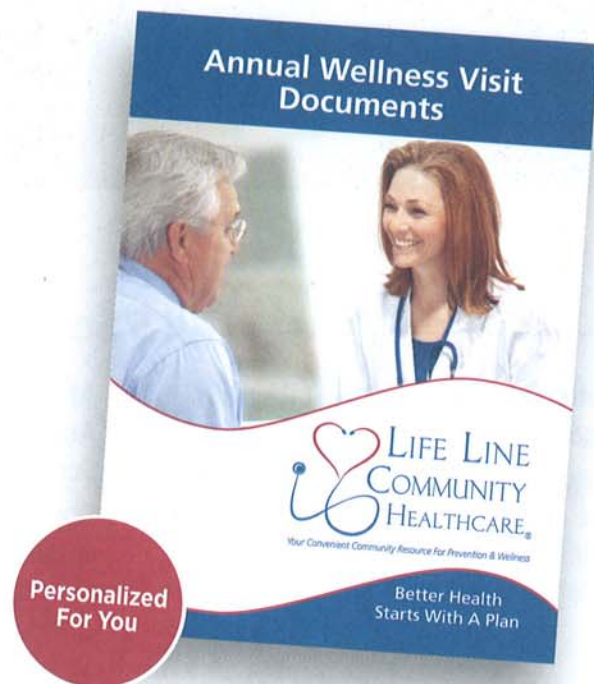

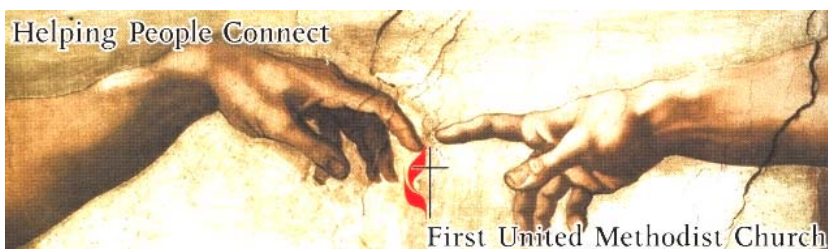
