This past week we continued on in our series on worship, “Flow.” We talked about worshipping in both Spirit and in Truth and how we are taking active steps to be in the “flow” of worship in our day to day lives. Pastor John focused on the practices and disposition of our hearts throughout the week that keep us in continual worship in our day to day lives. For Bible study we will look at John 7:37-39 to identify more of this flow.

Family Time

Worship Time

Bible Study

This week, take a look John 7:37-39 and explore the notion of “rivers of living water” being made available to those who believe in the Lord. This passage will be nicely juxtaposed with John 4:13 and the encounter with the Samaritan woman. Worship is not only the songs that we sing, but also the way that our lives are submitted to God as an offering outside of Sundays.

Discussion Questions

Break into small groups, or have a large group discussion based upon the following questions :

What do rivers of living water look like in my life in regards to worship?

What distractions or negative influences might be blocking my “flow” of worship?

What practices would aid or accelerate my personal “flow” of worship?
