



This past Sunday we got to celebrate what God did through Engage the Crisis! FAMILY TIME

Take some time to share prayer requests and praise reports with each other and encourage folks to keep praying for each other's prayer requests throughout the week and to believe that these will become future praise reports.

BIBLE DISCUSSION: Isaiah 6:1-8

Introduction Question: What is something you volunteered for that ended up being a really positive and/or impactful experience?

Key Discussion Questions:

- Why does Isaiah respond the way he does?
- What does the seraphim touching Isaiah's mouth signify and how might this have affected Isaiah?
- What do you notice about the Lord's call?
- What do you notice about Isaiah's call?

Reflection Question: For ETC, many folks from our church said "yes" to God and went to Berlin in order to serve God by loving refugees and Berliners. Many of us also said "yes" to God by supporting those who went to Berlin both financially and prayerfully. Now that ETC is over, what does it look like for us to continue to say "yes" to God right here in our communities?

Small Group: Break up into groups of 3-4 to share about how we think God might be calling us to say "yes" to him. Then pray for each other as we step out in these things.
