Introduction Question: Have you ever gotten into an altercation over a divisive issue?

Key discussion questions:

- What are things that Paul warns us against doing? Why does he do this?
- How does Paul encourage us to engage with others—particularly in situations where we might be tempted to get angry?
- How does the world engage with each other over divisive issues? How should we who are called to be salt and light?

Reflection Question: How can I be salt and light in today's atmosphere where complex issues threaten to divide our communities?

Small Group: Break up into groups of 3-4 to share how we can be salt and light in the way we engage with those around us particularly over potentially divisive issues. Then take time to pray for each other in these things.
