


Parent/Booster/ Support groups are extremely important in supporting students. But navigating the school public finance world (our job) with private money (the booster groups) can



Starting in the Middle

Category: Publication



The second edition of *Starting in the Middle* has been rewritten and redesigned as a resource book for teaching leadership concepts to middle-level students. In addition to 84 brand-new and revamped lessons for formal and informal classrooms, a section of "20 for 20" contains twenty-minute lessons designed for school-wide use in advisory or homeroom settings. Also included are resources for structuring a middle-level student leadership

program, aligning leadership instruction to standards, workshop/large group icebreakers, and organizational tools.

Fall Leadership Days
