THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body,

and the life everlasting.

SCRIPTURES AND PRAYERS

As you reflect on these passages, you can use the following pattern that builds in the practices of prayerful reading, inviting God to speak, and praying scripture:

Read. Invite the Holy Spirit's presence as you read the passage. *Pray.* Use words from the passage to pray it to Jesus and the Father. *Listen.* Pause and listen, and note what you sense the Holy Spirit communicating to you.
