#### **OUR STORY**

The Jassy Dean Trust began in 1993 and was born out of gratitude for the love and support the Dean family received from the Waiheke community when their teenage daughter, Jassy, was stricken with Meningococcal Meningitis and died.

The Trust is a voluntary community organisation. Our purpose is to support Waiheke tamariki with their health and wellbeing needs. Our vision is to empower Waiheke families, and our wider community, with resources to improve the health and wellbeing of tamariki.

The Waiheke Garden Festival has been the Trust's major fundraising event for 23 years. Many locals have been involved in this iconic event either by generously opening their gardens, volunteering to run the event, sponsoring or by attending this much loved event.

## What you need to know

The Gardens will be open from 10am-4pm, Saturday and Sunday. Entry with a wristband (ticket) only.

**Tickets** are available online at fullers.co.nz or in person at Fullers 360 Matiatia or Paper Plus Waiheke.
E-tickets can be exchanged for wristbands by volunteers at any garden. You can also buy tickets at each garden entrance. Tickets are valid for both days.

**Children** under the age of 14 years are free and welcome. Please note most of the gardens are not suitable for pushchairs.

No Pets - Please leave your pets at home as they are not allowed in these private gardens.

Refreshments - Enjoy morning tea, coffee and scones at Garden 2 and a leisurely lunch and licensed bar at Garden 8. See the map on pages 10 and 11 for details.

**Toilets** – Only a few gardens have visitor toilets. Please check the map on pages 10 and 11 for options.

Live music – Enjoy the best live local music between 12-2pm at Garden 8, with Alex Ludbrook and Peter Reilly on Saturday and four-piece band Sirens on Sunday, Pauline Stewart will also play delightful piano accordion tunes for morning tea at Garden 2. Thanks to these musicians for donating their time.

Cars - we invite you to drive but please be aware that



access to some properties can get crowded and patience is needed for parking. If you bring a car from Auckland, book via Sealink to enjoy a discounted festival ticket + car + passenger package.

Parking – many of our gardens have difficult road access and Waiheke has very narrow, windy roads. We encourage carpooling wherever possible and to comply with all parking signage and directions from volunteers. Bikes - we highly recommend biking. You can purchase a discounted e-bike hire and festival package thanks to eRide Waiheke. Head to fullers.co.nz for all ticket options. All bike riders are welcome to a free hot drink and scope at Garden 2!

Bus tour – Fullers 360 offers a wonderful bus tour option to visit selected gardens for those not wishing to drive. Book ahead as seats are limited. Buses leave from Matiatia.

Gardens with shuttle access only - cars cannot be parked at Gardens 4 or 6. A continuous free shuttle is offered instead. See more information in the descriptions for Gardens 4 and 6. Thanks to Waiheke High School and Go Rentals for providing the vehicles.

## **14 Tawa Street, Oneroa** *Robin and Graham Radford*

Ten years ago, this ½ acre garden presented its new owners with little more than a steep slope, an olive tree, a few fruit trees, a lot of punga and a view over magical Little Oneroa Bay. Robin and Graham set about developing the property by introducing garden-lined paths. Their creative landscaping now makes it an easy wander down the slope to a lushly underplanted punga grove. The emphasis is

on colour and exotic texture, both are amply provided by a rich variety of plants including hibiscus, canna and numerous large potted specimens of bromeliad and geranium. There are several highly productive, large, raised vegetable beds and still that lovely view over Little Oneroa Bay.



# **8 Shelly Beach Road, Surfdale** Simon and Mary Wright

This beautiful and productive seaside garden is overflowing with glorious flowers, fruit trees, berry plants and a bountiful veggie garden. Mary and Simon purchased the flat section overlooking beautiful

Putaki Bay fourteen years ago and have created a tranquil haven full of birdsong and fragrant plants. A recent addition to the garden is a modern, fully automated hen house where a brood of much-loved chooks enjoy a five-star living. Waiheke



Rachel has been a passionate gardener for as long as she can remember, and Richard is a professional horticulturist and landscaper. Their combined talents are obvious in this outstanding garden. A variety of plantings cover the 1391m2 sloped site, with well-built steps, a magnificent boardwalk and a stunning sea view over Putiki Bay. Meandering paths take you through a range of terraced gardens of exotic, sub-tropical and native plants. There are raised macrocarpa vegetable gardens, a fruit orchard, a hibiscus garden, and a slope of multi-coloured abutilon. There is a small shade house

for potting, a variety of nut trees, tropical fruit and a native area. Every group of plants has been thoughtfully placed offering visitors an inspirational experience. Access to this garden is via a free shuttle bus from the corner shop on Ostend Road where you may park your car.

#### Garden 5

#### Te Whau Retreat, 200 Te Whau Drive

The owners of this seven-acre property have transformed a 'post-build' raw and scarred clay landscape into well-established gardens that feel as if they have always been there over six years. They aimed to create a journey that reflected the landscape of Waiheke, to mix native and non-native plants,

to restore the land and to invite in the bird life. At the heart of the home, there is an internal courtyard planted with native plants grown from seedlings. It is tiled with handmade clay tiles and boasts a stunning homemade shade sail, both the work of the owner. The influence of Fiji is evident in the garden with tropical plantings of banana, sugar cane, curry leaves, chilli, frangipani and hibiscus all

thriving. This garden has been the main creative outlet for the owner. New paintings will be on display from talented local artist Tom Wilson who had a sell-out local show earlier this year, with a portion of sales benefiting the Jassy Dean Trust.

#### Garden 6

**16 Scotts Terrace, Onetangi** Margie and John Hatrick-Smith

This stunning garden is linked from the roadside entrance to the regenerating Forest & Bird Reserve below, through a series of cascading paths, garden beds and terraces. A wall of espaliered citrus greets the visitor at the top, followed by vegetable gardens, a thriving orchard with cutting flowers and beds of ornamentals. All

levels provide space for relaxation and watching the abundant bird life. The forest is full of kanuka, nikau and ponga with new plantings of thriving koekoe, tanekaha and kauri. Plants have often been chosen in memory of favourite people, chocolate irises named after Margie's grandmother, May, Auntie Mandy's runner beans and Uncle Bruce's dwarf beans.

This property is only accessible by bike or free shuttle bus from Onetangi Hall. Many thanks to GO Rentals Waiheke for donating the use of the shuttle bus.

## Garden 7

**375 Waiheke Road, Onetangi** Sandra and Peter Turley-Miller

Large sections of regenerated forest share space with spectacular rural views, border gardens, broad lawns and twisted flower-edged paths in a garden full of colour and variety. The 6 ½ hectare property, purchased in 1971 was originally part of the Pie Melon Bay Farm. Over the past 50 years much of

the land has reverted naturally to regenerating bush. Sandra and Peter have actively encouraged this process by planting multiple kauri, rimu and other natives throughout the forest. Six and a half years ago they moved to live permanently on the island and set about establishing new vegetable and flower gardens.

Internationally acclaimed botanical artist, Sue Wickison, will have merchandise on display with a percentage of sales donated to the Jassy Dean Trust.

## Garden 9

57-59 Cory Road, Palm Beach Alison and Paul Dyson

Alison and Paul have owned this 9.5-acre property for over 12 years. The heart of the garden and the owners' abiding passion is the impressive regeneration of the native forest that tumbles down to Palm Beach, Alison and Paul have also created 'home gardens'

with diverse plants and flowers that thrive on

the island. The 'crown jewel' is the vegetable garden where a steep, unusable north-facing site has been transformed into a terraced and productive garden. Raised beds are built of Corten steel and shaded with herb hedges protecting from the strong summer sun, a delightful and effective use of the space resulting in abundant crops at the same time offering an attractive sculptural quality. There is a roughly formed loop bush walking track accessible for more adventurous visitors.

The work of well-known Waiheke artist Zoe Leeb du Toit will be on sale at this garden with a percentage of proceeds donated to the Jassy Dean Trust.


