MISSOURI'S ENERGY FUTURE – SMART. SECURE. STABLE.

The electric grid is the backbone of Missouri's economy and by working together we can build a modern grid that is **Smart** and **Secure**, while also providing **Stable** rates for consumers.

That is why we support updating Missouri's 100 year-old regulatory policies in order to cut and cap energy rates for residential, commercial and industrial consumers. In addition we support legislation that will boost economic development, in our state, by creating thousands of quality jobs for the communities that need them most.

Currently, SB 564 seeks to cut rates by 4-5%, which is a result of the federal tax benefit and will be passed along to consumers within 90 days of the bill being signed into law. In addition, a hard 2.85% average annual rate cap will be in effect during the five year plan, which is roughly half the average annual increase consumers have been paying for energy over the last 10 years in Missouri.

Further, a minor policy adjustment can kick start \$1 billion of additional infrastructure investment over the next five years. These projects will create more than 3,000 jobs and provide consumers and Missouri businesses a host of benefits and efficiencies. These benefits include smart grid technologies to improve reliability and prevent some power outages, and further protect the grid from physical and cyber-attacks. In addition, updated policies will modernize the grid and offer a clearer path to cleaner and more renewable types of power such as the expansion of wind and solar generation.

We encourage you to join us in this effort to transform Missouri's energy policy, while also creating a modern grid that will have a variety of consumer benefits that many other states are currently enjoying.
