CHASING 50/50

A comparative report of female filmmakers represented at Nordic Film International Film Festival 2018 and female representation in the 250 top grossing films of 2016.



SUMMARY NIFF 2018

In 87.5% of our 24 films in our Official Selection (22 out of our 24 films), we found at least one woman in a power position - such as director, writer, producer or executive producer. This number is increased from our 85% of last year.

Further - we continued to analyze the number of females versus males in all power positions in our Official Selection. We were also curious to see how we at NIFF do in comparison to the film industry at large. Below is a summary of our findings, followed by a detailed breakdown of our statistics compared to the 250 top grossing films of 2016.


QUALITY OVER QUOTATION

For NIFF 2018, we wanted to calculate the exact percentages of males and females in power positions in the films that were selected for our Official Selection. As female representation in the film industry is a current hot topic, we wanted to compute the female composition in directors, executive producers, producers, writers, editors, and cinematographers in our lineup. As shown in the following slides, our numbers showcase impressive female representation at NIFF.


In order to compare our numbers with the larger film industry, we pulled data from the 250 top-grossing independent and studio films of 2016. The study is called 'The Celluloid Ceiling: Behind-the-Scenes Employment of Women on the Top 100, 250, and 500 Films of 2016', From these numbers, we compare our own. Once again, we exhibit outstanding, empowering results.

We also want to mention that NIFFs programmers don't look at the filmmaker until after the first rating of the film – making sure we lead our Official Selection with quality and not a quotation.


Representation at NIFF 30 total 46.7% female 53.3% male




Representation in the study 'The Celluloid Ceiling' 250 total 7% female 93% male




Representation at NIFF 25 total 28% female 72% male






Representation at NIFF 51 total 56.9% female 43.1% male






Representation at NIFF 30 total 46.7% female 53.3% male






Representation at NIFF 27 total 48.1% female 51.9% male


