

#### DEATH OF JAMES JACKSON, ESQ.

Fattening of the Heart Caused a Sudden Death—Funeral This Morning.

Yesterday morning when the report of the death of James Jackson, Esq., was repeated about town, it seemed almost incredible, since on the day before he was at his office attending to his regular duties, as a Justice of the Peace and as late as night fall was with a crowd of friends spinning yarns and amusing them with his unique humor.

Not until 3 o'clock in the morning did the pains about his heart begin and they barely suspended his slumbers. At 5 o'clock he awoke suddenly and called to his wife that he was suffering intensely and in a few minutes death came from a fattening of the heart.

Mr. Jackson was born and reared near Coosada, Elmore County, and he had been living in Montgomery thirty years. He was a son of Mr. Absalom Jackson and his brothers and sisters are Dr. Jackson, Messrs. William, Absalom and Crawford Jackson, Mrs. Leary and Mrs. Barron. Mr. Jackson leaves a wife, Mrs. M. A. Jackson, two daughters, Mrs. A. S. Cowan and Mrs. E. A. Hudson, and one son, Mr. James T. Jackson. The funeral will occur from the family home on Madison Avenue this morning.

Mr. Jackson was a fearless and faithful Confederate soldier, beloved by his comrades. After the war he went to work on the M. and E. Railroad and for a number of years was one of the most prominent and popular conductors on the line. Governor O'Neal appointed him a Notary Public and Justice of the Peace, which office he has held since the O'Neal administration. Mr. Jackson was a good husband and father, a whole-souled, courageous man, true to his friends, and when he thought himself in the right all earth could not move him.
