Fasting Guide

The type of fast you go on is between you and God. However, here are some options:

- ❖ A Normal (Full) Fast – Abstain from food, drink only liquids (water and / or specific juices).
- ❖ The Daniel Fast – See sample listing of foods below.
- ❖ Combination Fast – Begin the first three days with a full or normal fast. Continue by observing the Daniel Fast for the remaining period of your fast.
- ❖ Media Fast – A decision to limit or completely abstain from media (television, gaming, social media, etc.) for a specific period of time.

If you are on medication or have a medical condition, please consult your doctor before beginning a fast (other than media).



Fighting The Good Fight of Faith

During your fast, one of your biggest obstacles will be your mind and your memory. Fasting will not make sense to your mind.

When Peter was walking on the water in Matthew 14:22-32, he found himself in the middle of a miracle. When Peter's mind revealed to him the supernatural nature of what he was doing, it convinced him that it was impossible, based on what his mind knew to be normal. Consequently, Peter sank, believing logically what his mind told him, rather than what the Spirit convinced him to believe by faith.

There will be times that your mind will realize how far out on a limb your faith has taken you and you will be faced with a decision: Do you give up or keep moving forward?

Galatians 5:24 tells us that the flesh is at war against the Spirit. It cannot be trained or negotiated with. The flesh must die. It must be crucified.

When you feel as though you want to give up, you must ask yourself if the pain you are experiencing is worth the prize you are pursuing?

In **John 6:66**, the disciples were asked by Jesus if they wanted to go back to their old lifestyle. Peter said, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of life."

Never confuse your fasting goals with the most foundational reason to fast – to meet with God. All other reasons could cause you to miss the biggest blessing of your fasting experience.

Daniel Fast Sample Listing of Foods

Foods to Enjoy:

- Whole grains, brown rice, oats, barley
- Fruits, vegetables, seeds, nuts, sprouts, beans
- Liquids: spring water, distilled water, 100% all natural juices
- Honey

Foods to Avoid:

- Meat...Fish...Fowl
- White rice, fried foods, refined sugar, sugar substitutes,
- White flour and all products using it

A Prayer Strategy

DAY 1: Monday, January 8, 2018

DAILY READING: Acts 4:1-31

There will be times when you have to do something but don't know what to do. You will experience unfamiliar situations. The Bible is filled with instances where people have felt much like you. Consider Moses facing an impassable Red Sea while pursued by Pharaoh. Imagine Daniel awaiting death from hungry lions, the Apostle Paul enduring a terrible storm in a ship being torn apart. Feel the isolation of the Apostle John, exiled to die on a remote island. Inevitably, they and others like them turned to God in their most challenging circumstances and God did not fail them.

The Bible reports of Peter and John that the religious leaders, "took note that these men had been with Jesus." If you spend time with Jesus, others notice a difference. Soon after Jesus' ascension, Peter and John were arrested and threatened if they dared speak of Jesus again. Jesus always faced opposition and He always knew what to do. But Jesus was no longer with them as before, they were on their own. "After they prayed, the place was shaken. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the Word of God boldly." Acts 4:31 NIV. Like those early disciples, this is what you do when you don't know what to do.

(1) **First, pray with faith.** "Lord, behold their threatenings." Acts 4:29. Prayer is too often the second, third, or last thing we think of doing when facing threatening situations. Begin with prayer; then, you may not need to worry.

(2) **Ask God for what you lack.** "Lord . . . enable Your servants . . . with great boldness." Acts 4:29. They had reason to be afraid, but fear like faith is really a choice. Fear thrives when you feel threatened. Faith grows when you choose to let God be God. Don't listen to your fears; listen for God's assuring word. "So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing comes by the Word of God." Romans 10:17. The Word in your heart makes you bold in your faith.

(3) **Expect God to do the extraordinary.** "Stretch out Your hand to heal and perform miraculous signs and wonders." Acts 4:30. Why pray at all if you don't expect something spectacular from God? Give God an invitation to display His power.

A Spirit-filled heart expects something amazing and miraculous from God.

"Whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours."
Mark 11:24 NIV.

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Giving God the Right-of-Way

DAY 2: Tuesday, January 9, 2018

DAILY READING: Psalms 27:8; 2 Chronicles 7:1-14

Seeking God's face is one of the greatest acts of worship unto God. When you begin to seek God with all your heart, your mind, your soul and with all your strength, that act demonstrates that you have a sincere desire to give God the right-of-way in your life. It also tells God that you want Him to lead, guide and direct your life.

"When You said, "seek My face" my heart said to you, "Your face, Lord, I will seek." Psalm 27:8

King David understood the importance of seeking the presence of God in every area of his life, for he could not make a move or a decision without consulting and inquiring of the Lord. Likewise, in this very hour, we are called to live out Matthew 6:33 in our daily lives, *"But SEEK FIRST the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you."* Now ask yourself these questions today:

How often do you seek the plans of God, the purpose of God, the direction of God, the desire of God and the will of God for your life?

God says in 2 Chronicles 7:14 *"if My people who are called by My name will humble themselves, and pray and SEEK MY FACE, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land."*

The Bible has clearly shown us that our lives will take twists and turns when we lose our desire to seek God's face. But, when we turn our face to God with our whole heart, He will hear from heaven forgive our sins and heal our land.

Pray and ask God to:

- ✓ Forgive you when you let others pull you away from seeking Him.
- ✓ Forgive you when you took your focus off Him.
- ✓ Forgive you when you desired to go your own way and not His way.
- ✓ Forgive you when you stopped believing and trusting in Him, but was trusting in man.
- ✓ Show you the distractions in your life that has caused you to take your focus off Him.
- ✓ Search your heart and expose anything that has caused a hindrance from you pursuing His purpose for your life.

You have asked and He is faithful to forgive. Now turn from your ways and as you give Him the right-of-way prepare to "go beyond" to a "higher dimension of worship."



Beyond Yesterday

DAY 3: Wednesday, January 10, 2018

DAILY READING: Genesis 41:25-49

“Forgetting the past and looking forward to what lies ahead.” Philippians 3:13.

A good memory is a good thing, if it is the good that you remember. Sometimes forgetfulness can be good. Strangely enough, people seem to remember what they should forget and forget things they should remember. There are too many things that only bring worry or pain, stuff for which you have no answer or explanation. Those things accumulate crowding out more beneficial things that encourage and edify.

The Old Testament story of Joseph is a good example that life works better when you remove the weights. His history held a lot of hurt. Some resulted from his lack of wisdom, but most of his pain was imposed upon him by others. To survive and keep his dreams, Joseph had to learn how to take off the weights from his unfair and painful past. He forgave and forgot.

Forgiveness without forgetting is not as freeing as God intends. In Egypt, two sons were born to Joseph. His first son he named Manasseh meaning, “For God made me forget all my trouble.” Forgetting is where healing begins. His second son he named Ephraim meaning, “For God has made me fruitful in my suffering.” Remembering can be where celebrating begins.

Regrets? Everyone has a few. Mistakes, mishaps, or misunderstandings may have affected your assessment of the past, but in grace, God has given you the power of choice to greatly reshape a new year.

Paul writes *“I am still not all I should be, but I am focusing all my energies on this one thing: forgetting the past and looking forward to what lies ahead, I strain to reach the end of the race and receive the prize for which God, through Christ Jesus, is calling us up to heaven.”* Philippians 3:13-14.

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God Will Stop What Has Been Stopping You

DAY 4: Thursday, January 11, 2018

DAILY READING: Acts 27:9-44

"Gather up the fragments that remain, so that nothing is lost." John 6:12 NKJV.

There are not many things, if any, that are truly unbreakable. Things break. Some broken things can be repaired, some can be replaced and some cannot. In our lives we experience broken plans, broken dreams, broken hearts, broken marriages and families. Some things can be fixed others cannot. Life can be fragile. Lives can be left in shambles, frequently by our own mistakes but occasionally as the result of someone else's words or actions.

The Bible is full of the stories of men and women whose lives were just broken pieces, people left with only the fragments of their shattered hopes and expectations. A woman of Samaria was drawing water at Jacob's well at the unlikely time of midday when Jesus paused on His journey through Samaria to Galilee. Jesus touched the brokenness of her life and everything of the past was changed.

"If you fall to pieces in a crisis, there wasn't much to you in the first place."
Proverbs 24:10 (Message)

One of the most repeated phrases in the Bible is the phrase "It came to pass." Actually there are 463 references to "it came to pass" in the Bible. The phrase is a transition statement which means that something occurred at a particular time that shifted what was occurring. Joseph was in prison and seemed like everyone had forgotten him, but in Genesis 41, the Bible says "it came to pass" that Pharaoh had a dream. In Egypt there was a generation of God's people who were born in bondage, lived in bondage and only knew bondage but Exodus says "it came to pass after four hundred and thirty years...".

In Acts 27, Paul had an assignment from God but faced difficult circumstances on his journey. He was arrested and knew his life was in danger. He is being transported and the ship encounters a storm. The storm is so severe, their ship is broken into pieces. Any hope of coming out of the storm alive was gone. Acts 27:43 tells that God put someone on that ship whose sole purpose was to make sure Paul would get to his destination.

Regardless of the storms that may break your dreams, shipwreck your life or challenge your family, God can take the broken pieces, make a little raft and bring you beyond the storms.

Thank Him today that the situations and circumstances that have come to you in life, did not come to stay, but they all came to pass.

Developing A Grateful Heart

DAY 5: Friday, January 12, 2018

DAILY READING: Psalm 33

"Be thankful in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you who belong to Christ Jesus.

1 Thess. 5:18

It is important to realize that genuine thankfulness is intimately bound up with trust. We may never truly thank God until we first truly trust Him. We may not be grateful to God for all that we have until we first recognize that we're dependent on Him for all that we have.

The LORD is my strength and shield. I trust him with all my heart. He helps me, and my heart is filled with joy. I burst out in songs of thanksgiving. Psalm 28:7

By nature, we're not trusting creatures. We're creatures of necessity. We trust God when we're *forced* to trust Him because our problems go beyond our abilities. If we can solve the problem by ourselves, we don't resort to prayer and trusting God, because we don't *need* to trust Him for what we can do on our own.

If the key to a grateful worshiping heart is to rely completely on the Lord, then the question arises, **"How do I learn to rely completely on the Lord?"**

- ✓ We learn to rely completely on the Lord by recognizing the power of His word. Psalm 33:6-9 (NLT).

Complete trust in the Lord results in a grateful worshiping heart. Thankfulness and worship are bound up with trusting in the Lord. When you have no human means of escape and you cry out to God as your only hope and He delivers you, your heart overflows in gratitude and praise to Him.

David said in Psalm 116:17, *"I will sacrifice a thank offering to you and call on the name of the Lord."*

Thanksgiving has great power to bring joy and break the power of the enemy. Whenever you give thanks to God, despite the most difficult circumstances, the enemy loses a big battle in your life.

Beyond your wildest dreams lies an eternal destiny more real and more incredible than you could possibly imagine. When you offer thanks out of a truly grateful heart, you enter into a "higher dimension of worship", where the enemy no longer has an ability to manipulate you or hold you back.

Beyond Circumstances

DAY 6: Saturday, January 13, 2018

DAILY READING: 2 Kings 6: 8 – 23; Galatians 3

*These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have **overcome** the world. John 16:33 - NKJV*

As we step into the Beyond Life, we must first recognize the things that might try to distract us, things that minimize the manifestation of this Beyond Life. There are circumstances and situations that present themselves negatively; these things cause us discomfort and seek to steal our attention and focus. We can be coerced into paying attention to these negative things and not paying attention to God's GPS for our life. We must listen to God and allow the circumstances to be things that we **know** we overcome. We must know that circumstances come and go and change, tribulations come and go and change, trials come and go and they change. Our God is the same yesterday, today and forever. He never changes and he has already overcome the world!

As Christ followers, we must make sure that the truth concerning our life is in agreement with His Word, and not with our circumstances. You might say, "How do we do that? How do we focus on the Word and not our circumstances, after all we're living these circumstances?"

- ✓ Ask God to open your eyes for you to see the life that He intends for you to live.
- ✓ Get a clear picture. Your picture must be extremely clear and precise.
- ✓ Focus on that picture every day, many times each day.
- ✓ Cast down every imagination that is contrary to the promise that God has made to you, 2 Corinthians 10:5.

"the way of the upright is a highway." Proverbs 15:19

Life may be a highway but there are some unexpected bends and curves. If you are committed to progress you won't be stranded on the highway, but you will come through the twists and turns and receive the promise. Don't stop believing in healing because you were sick once; don't settle for a lifetime of unemployment because you were laid off; don't get a divorce just because you disagree on some things; don't settle for lack just because your bank account is near empty.

Keep believing. Keeping saying. Keeping praying. Stay in faith.

This could be the year that God does a miracle you didn't ask for!

Beyond Normal Responses

DAY 8: Monday, January 15, 2018

DAILY READING: 2 Samuel 1:1-18

How would you respond if you heard that something bad happened to someone who had been trying to cut your head off for several years? King Saul had been seeking to kill David for many years before Saul was thrust into battle against the Amalekites. In this final battle, a sword killed Saul. When the news reached David, instead of rejoicing that his enemy was no longer a problem for him, he responded in a totally different manner. He mourned. Imagine that- he mourned for the one who sought to kill him.

This story is a sign of one who can look past an individual who is the source of pain and consider how God views him. God look on that individual and sees his needs and knows why he responds the way he does. When we begin to see people as God does, we'll no longer look at them as enemies, but as souls in need of grace. This is how Jesus could give of his life for us. He saw our great need, not what we did to Him.

When someone wrongs you, do you seek to retaliate, or do you pray to understand the need behind the offenders action? God may choose to give you a picture of that person inside a prison cell and in bondage. This bondage may ultimately be the cause for him responding the way he did. It may be responsible for a lifestyle that is out of control. The proper thing for the believer to do is pray for and genuinely love him in spite of the errant behavior.

This is the kind of love Jesus wants us to have when he wants us to love our enemies and pray for those who spitefully use us. God does a special work of grace in those who go beyond the realm of normal response, bringing us to a level of grace we may have never known.

Prayer: Lord, help me to see life through your eyes. From heaven down things look different than from the earth as a vantage point. May I have the grace to offer up love and compassion beyond normal responses. I pray that a changed heart may come to my foes as well as to me. Help me to become more like you and model your ways for the world to see. Amen

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Divine Potential

Day 9: Tuesday, January 16, 2018

DAILY READING: Colossians 4

Your innate desire to be more than you have been is from God. You have a God-given potential to become more than you have imagined. Boundaries are limits imposed by yourself or others. You were created “in the image and likeness of God.”

Imagine the potential, presently and eternally, that God has invested in you. The only uncertainty is whether you will recognize and realize the divine potential within you. When you think of “achieving your potential,” what do you envision? Your capabilities will likely be more than your accomplishments.

Spiritual maturity is the pathway to your potential. “

. . . that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.”
Ephesians 4:12 NIV.

Maturity is not measured by comparison with others. Paul warned of those who,

“. . . measure themselves by themselves, and comparing themselves among themselves are not wise.” 2 Corinthians 10:12.

Jesus is the only adequate and accurate standard for comparison. Not only is Jesus the standard by which you will be measured, He is the willing accomplice for all of your spiritual accomplishment.

Spiritual maturity is the goal; becoming like Jesus is the process. Be patient, your spiritual potential is achieved progressively in a process that is lifelong.

“As the Spirit of the Lord works within us, we become more and more like Him and reflect His glory even more.” 2 Corinthians 3:18 NLT

Usually, we seem unclear as to the practical implications of Christ-likeness. Here is a useful practical definition. **“Spiritual maturity is rightly responding to life’s situations according to Biblical patterns of behavior.”** Spiritual maturity is achieved through a growing knowledge of the Word of God and a deepening obedience to the ways of God.

Welcome the Holy Spirit to rule your heart. Make prayer a daily priority. And let love be your lifestyle.

The Famine that Lead to Freedom

DAY 10: Wednesday, January 17, 2018

DAILY READING: Genesis 42:1-2; Isaiah 66:9; 18-23


F.B. Meyer in his book, THE LIFE OF JOSEPH, describes a time in the life of the 12 sons of Jacob in which they were driven from their lives of self-satisfaction to an unlikely place to save their lives. Many years earlier, they had thrown their youngest brother into a pit, then sold him into slavery. Thirteen years later he became the second most powerful person in all of Egypt. Now the world was experiencing a famine and Joseph controlled all the stored grain of Egypt.

As long as the hills were green and the pastures clothed with flocks, as long as the valleys were covered with corn and rang with the songs of reapers, Reuben, Simeon and the others would have been unconcerned and content. But when the mighty famine came, the hearts of these men were opened to conviction. Their security was shattered. They were being prepared for certain spiritual experiences they would never have dreamed. And they were being prepared for a meeting with Joseph.

Joseph was a type of Christ in the Old Testament. The famine was an event designed to bring the brothers to repentance, both physically and spiritually. The tragedy of the famine created the circumstances that led to freedom for these men, and it was forgiveness from Joseph that caused them to be free.

Is your life passing through a time of famine? Are your supplies limited? Is God leading you into directions that you would not normally seek? Now is the time to look attentively as God directs you to unlikely sources; His leading will take you beyond average to a life of purpose and significance.

The choices you make will be God directed and carry a long term perspective for impact so that you might turn the moment into momentum.





Living The Life That God Has For You

DAY 11: Thursday, January 18, 2018

DAILY READING: Romans 12

Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, 16 making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil.

Eph. 5:15-16

All moments are not created equally. There are holy moments where our obedience creates momentum from those moments. Insignificant moments prepare us for the moments that seem significant. God prepares you for the moment when you might think He is not looking so that you are prepared for the moment that everyone can see.

In 1 Samuel 17, David has been anointed as the future king of Israel. He is instructed by his father to take his brothers a loaf of bread. Although he is doing something that seemed insignificant, the moment came that would matter more than any other moment that he had experienced in his life.

When David arrives, the nation is about to go to war, so he hears the battle cry, Goliath comes out and David hears what he says. When he heard what he said, David did something about it and what he did delivered a nation.

Think about the events of that day:

- David delivered the nation
- He wouldn't have delivered the nation if he wouldn't have done something about Goliath.
- He wouldn't have acted if he hadn't heard the cry.
- He wouldn't have heard the cry if he would have missed the moment that seemed so insignificant. God is demonstrating the importance of missing the moment in 2018.

This 2018 time of fasted prayer is not a highlight of what God will do this year, but a preview of what He wants to do. Every moment is designed for you to become the person you were meant to be.

What to do when God brings you to a moment like this? Obey Him when He asks you to do an insignificant thing.

- ✓ This is your moment.
- ✓ Your moment has not passed.
- ✓ Your moment is not some time in the future
- ✓ Your moment is now

Speak The Language

DAY 12: Friday, January 19, 2018

DAILY READING: Matthew 4: 1 – 11; Mark 11

"Therefore, having put away falsehood, let each one of you speak the truth with his neighbor, for we are members one of another. Be angry and do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, and give no opportunity to the devil. Let the thief no longer steal, but rather let him labor, doing honest work with his own hands, so that he may have something to share with anyone in need. Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear. And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you." Ephesians 4:25-32

Consider yourself living the Beyond Life. Obstacles come and you overcome them. Your prayers are being answered. You are healthy in your body. You have more than enough to complete the work that God has called you to do. Your family is living in unity and you are examples that others follow. What was the path to this place? An indicator is the words we speak.

Our example is God Himself. In creation, Genesis 1, God spoke what He wanted to see and He saw it come to pass. You are created in His image and after His likeness, Genesis 1:27.

"You will have whatever you say" Mark 11: 23, 24.

You have the power to create the life that God intends for you to live. Are there times you have spoken the Word and immediately follow it up with a contradiction to what you have said? You may have spoken the Word with limited understanding of its power.

It is important to be extremely mindful of your communication. Your speaking cannot be based on how you feel or what you're thinking at the time. Challenge yourself to only speak the things that you want to come to pass. If you state a fact that is negative, do not rehearse it over and over, but cover it with your faith in God's Word. Speak the Word over your situations and boldly declaring what God has said.

The enemy will always contradict God's Word. He will twist the Word to confuse you or cause you to compromise what you really know to be true.

He attempted during his temptation of Jesus. Satan waited until Jesus was hungry and weak, then he twisted God's Word, but Jesus responded, "It is written..." That is our example. Regardless of how you feel, speak the language of God. Speak the Word.

Take the Challenge: Get an accountability partner and take an inventory of your conversation for 24 hours. Anything spoken that is negative, immediately cover it with the Word of God. As you practice this daily, your speech will be seasoned with salt and will be as sweet as honey.

Prepare To Go Beyond In 2018

DAY 13: Saturday, January 20, 2018

DAILY READING: Joshua 1:1-10

"Moses my servant is dead. Now then, you and all these people, get ready to cross the Jordan River into the land I am about to give to them - to the Israelites" (Joshua 1:2).

This was a new season for Joshua and a new season for the Israelites. Joshua was a faithful servant of Moses and did not expect to suddenly become the leader of over two million people. He did not plan on taking them into their next phase of possessing lands and developing as a nation. God, however, will never lead you where His grace will not keep you and His glory not give you victory.

GOD COACHED JOSHUA FOR A SUCCESSFUL NEW SEASON. (Joshua 1:3-9).

- Expect new open doors. (Verse 3)
- I am in control of your boundaries. (Verse 4)
- I will be with you and fight for you. (Verse 5)
- Don't let the devil's schemes of discouragement overcome you. (Verse 6)
- Study and obey God's word. (Verses 7,8)
- Do not let fear conquer your faith. (Verse 9)

There is power in making declarations & decrees over your life that aligns you with God's Word.

"You will also declare a thing, and it will be established for you; so light will shine on your ways." Job 22:28 NKJV

- ❖ I declare and decree that this will be a breakout year because God has heard my voice and my cry for mercy.
 - "I love the LORD, for he heard my voice; he heard my cry for mercy. Because he turned his ear to me, I will call on him as long as I live." Psalm 116:1–2 NIV
- ❖ I decree a time of renewing my strength and soaring in Your presence God.
 - ... but those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint." Isaiah 40:31 NIV
- ❖ I declare that the times of disappointments have come to an end. This is a year of sudden good breaks.
 - "Unrelenting disappointment leaves you heartsick, but a sudden good break can turn life around." Proverbs 13:12 MSG
- ❖ I decree that I will step into a place this year to have greater authority to see answers to the things I ask for in prayer.
