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Short Biography

Dr. Rositsa T. Ilieva is an architect-urban planner and an expert in policies, planning, and design for sustainable cities and urban food systems. At present, Dr. Ilieva is an adjunct lecturer at the Parsons School of Design of The New School university in New York City and is affiliated with the Milano School of International Affairs, Management, and Urban Policy. Until 2015, she served as a Post-Doctoral Research Fellow in Urban Food Systems at the Tishman Environment and Design Center (TEDC) at the same university, where she taught courses and conducted research in urban food policy and planning for sustainable cities. Dr. Ilieva holds a B.S. and a M.S. degrees in Architecture *Cum Laude* and a Ph.D. in Spatial Planning and Urban Development *Cum Laude* from the Polytechnic University of Milan, Italy. She has presented her research at numerous international research conferences and is author of “[Urban Food Planning: Seeds of Transition in the Global North](#)” (Routledge, 2016).
