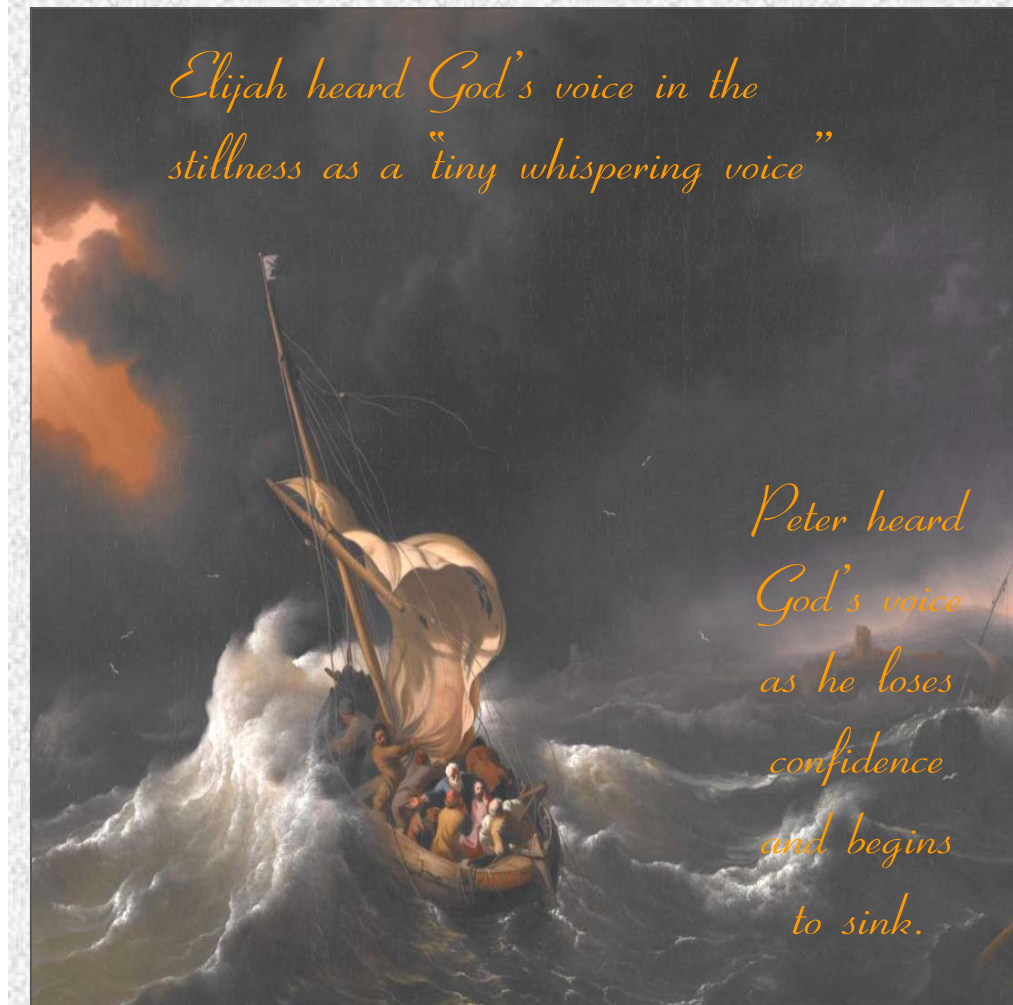

Nineteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

August 13, 2017

Elijah heard God's voice in the stillness as a "tiny whispering voice."

Peter heard God's voice as he loses confidence and begins to sink.

Scripture reveals today that God is with us in our silent moments (as Elijah heard) and in our distressing times (as Peter did). This scripture invites us to reflect:

- What in your life is similar to the story of Elijah or that of the apostles in the storm?
- How have I experienced the voice and the presence of God in the serenity of prayer?
- How have I experienced the voice and the presence of God in my days of strife and struggle?

Faith consecrates our every moment and every place, every action and even every thought. Jesus comes to us endlessly in recognizable circumstance (liturgy and prayer) and unexpected ways (in those in need, in good surprises, in the visits of loved ones.) When we come to acknowledge Jesus' abiding presence, we proclaim as the apostles did, "Beyond doubt, you are the Son of God!"

TODAY we are hosting Joe Raguso, with a Mission Appeal from COAR



We welcome Joe Raguso, past board president of COAR. COAR stands for "Community Oscar Arnulfo Romero," which was founded in 1980 by Fr. Ken Myers during El Salvador's brutal civil war. COAR is known as the "Children's Village" which gathers orphans from refugee camps. The camp has 800 day students and 100 in foster care.

Mr. Raguso was a close personal friend of Fr. Ken Myers and has been involved in the outreach effort since 1996. He has visited COAR many times and speak with authority about the deep, healing, vital nature of the care, education and
