Twenty-first Sunday of Ordinary Time

August 27, 2017

"You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. The second is like it: You shall love our neighbor as yourself."

Becoming King of France at the age of 12, his mother inspired him with a love of holy things so much so that as king he attended two Masses a day. At his coronation he bound himself as God's anointed and interpreted his duties in the light of faith. Louis dedicated his life, his family, his country to the King of kings. He married Marguerite of Provence and they had 11 children.

St. Louis imbued French culture with a deep sense of divine justice. Although he enjoyed the finer things in life, including good wine and food, he never lost sight of the poor. At each meal Louis had 13 guests from among the poor eat with him. A large number of poor were served meals near his palace. During Advent and Lent, all who presented themselves were given a meal.

Louis built churches, libraries, hospitals and orphanages. This humble servant of God often served the poor in person, visited the sick and kept a list of needy people, whom he regularly helped.

He reformed civil administrations so that a person at trial used a form of examination of witnesses. Louis promoted innovations in Gothic art and architecture. He possessed skills as an arbitrator. Countries at war asked his intervention.

Even with many constraints upon his time, he managed to spend several hours a day in prayer.

Today we celebrate his lived commitment to the gospel message and the founding of the city of St. Louis 252 years ago.
