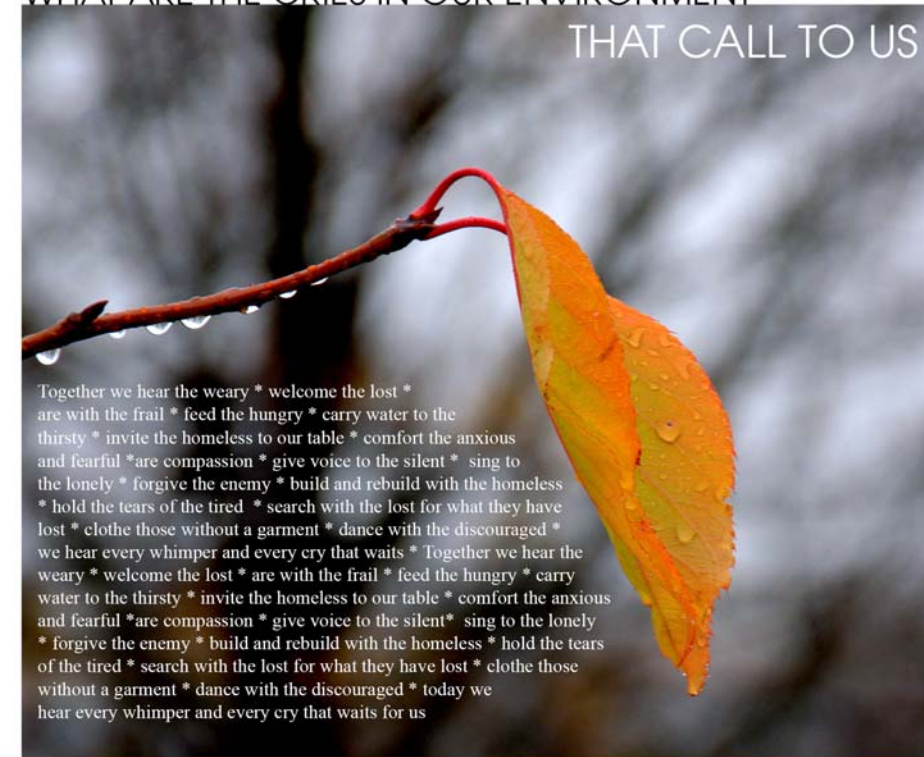

Exodus 22:22

Today's first reading names examples of concern and compassion for those "at risk" groups of people in the socioeconomic system of the Israelites – the foreigner, widows, orphans, and the poor. God is the compassionate one who says, "I will surely hear their cry."

There are many ways that you can surely hear the cries of the poor: listen to the weary, feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, welcome the homeless, comfort the anxious and fearful, forgive the enemy, encourage the tired, search with the lost for what they have lost, clothe those without a garment, encourage the discouraged, stand by the frail, be company for the lonely.

**Today:** the Book with the names of our deceased loved one will be carried in the offertory procession and placed on the altar in special remembrance of our deceased loved ones.

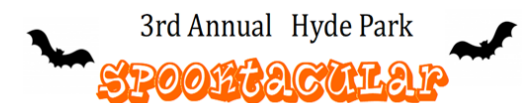
