

AIMS Testing Information

AIMS Testing is **NOT** required for homeschool students in Arizona, but parents can choose to have their students take the AIMS test if they are interested.

If you choose to have your student take the AIMS test, you should take the following steps:

- ◆ Contact the school district that you live in to sign your student up to take the test.
- ◆ Visit the Arizona Department of Education's website to check out testing for the different grade levels.
- ◆ Consider having your student take a practice AIMS test. These practice questions can also be found on the Arizona Department of Education's website.

Frequently Asked Questions:

Q. Where will my student take the test?

A. Your student will most likely be tested at the school within the district boundaries of your home.

Q. What happens to my student's test results?

A. Your student's AIMS results will be mailed to you.

Q. When does testing usually take place?

A. Testing for high school students usually takes place in the spring and fall. Testing for elementary and middle school students takes place in the spring. Check with your school district or the Arizona Department of Education for exact testing dates and times.
