Use of the Blues scale:

The Blues scale is one of the simplest ways for young players to feel like they can actually look at a chord progression and "know what to do". The blues scales is primarily used to play over the 3 or 4 chords of a traditional blues progression. In the case of using only the blues scale to improvise in a given key, ONLY the scale beginning on the tonic of the given key is used (i.e. B-flat blues scale for a B-flat blues progression).
