Credit Options

BYU Online High School

Students can be enrolled in BYU online classes to meet credit requirements. Instructions for access and work within those specific classes will be given at enrollment.

A Plus

On the Firefox browser, go to the website aplus.loganschools.org. Click on the red tab that says “web start”. Enter your logon name. You will start by taking a pretest. If you pass the pretest with 80% or better, you pass the lesson and move on. If you don’t pass, you need to study for a minimum of 5 minutes. Take notes, review and learn what you don’t know. After 5 minutes, you will be able to take a practice test. If you pass the practice test with 80% or better, then you can take the mastery test. Mastery test needs to be passed with 70% or better. You don’t need to do the essays. If you need to know a definition, you may go to dictionary.com to find it, but that is all you may use the internet for. You may not search for answers to questions. If you do, you will lose credit for what you have done on A Plus and will need to find a different way to earn credit. You can get APlus from home on your time as well as in class.

Face to Face

Teachers will assess the needs of the students and select classes to teach live nightly. These classes will require full attendance, homework and participation. Teachers will tell you the requirements, credit and policies on the syllabus for each class.

Packets

On an individual basis, packets or outside work can be completed to earn credit. Possible packets for credit are: Art, Computer Tech.

PE Credit can be achieved by tracking your daily exercise on a PE log that staff can give you. Track your workout routines, walking, jogging, weightlifting, sports you play, etc. 30 hours = .25 credit.

Career & Technical Education (CTE) credit can be earned by turning in pay stubs from legitimate employment. 225 hours = .25 credit. General elective credit can be earned this way as well up to 4 credits total. 1 credit CTE and 3 more to general elective or if CTE is not needed then 4 to general elective. Along with work hours, staff will present job training and assignments for you to complete and bring in guest speakers to teach about work/career related topics.

TABE workbooks – TABE workbooks will help you prepare and score better on TABE assessments; completion of workbooks will also earn credit.

Additional credit can be earned from service in **the Armed Forces** or certifications you already have from school or job training. See teachers for more info.

Taking the GED test

You can register for the GED Test online at www.GEDtestingservice.com. It costs \$30 per subtest or you can take the entire test for \$120.
