
Celebrations

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REPORTS/ DISCUSSION/ ACTION

Discussion: Loreen Flanary, District Preschool Coordinator, shared the benefits and successes of the preschool program in the District. They are focusing on relationships and routines similar to those in the elementary schools. Community outreach events were shared.

Discussion: Director of Secondary Schools, Liz Dickenson, answered questions regarding the secondary ELA curriculum. Materials are available for review. A vote to approve the presented curriculum will take place at a future meeting.
