## A Healthy Environment

From an article by Victoria Prooday:

A healthy environment for children looks like this:

- ♥ Emotionally available parents (not distracted by devices)
- ♥ Clearly defined limits and guidance (Saying no is okay; in fact, it's your job!)
- ♥ Assignment of responsibilities (Children need chores.)
- ♥ Balanced nutrition and adequate sleep (wide variety of foods and an

early bedtime)

- ♥ Movement and outdoor time (the more the better!)
- ♥ Creative play, social interaction, and opportunities for unstructured times (including boredom!)

Some ideas to help you provide this environment:

- ♥ Play outdoors at least an hour each day.
- ♥ Allow no devices during mealtime (including your own).

- ♥ Play one board game every day.
- ♥ Let your children help with simple tasks: folding laundry, making beds, setting the table
- ♥ Set bedtime at a consistent hour; for preschool children, 7:00 - 8:00 p.m. is ideal.
- ♥ Impose natural consequences: Examples include not delivering a forgotten item (backpack or lunch) to school; not peeling a banana for a 5-year old.
