Giving Financially At Eucharist

Jesus said “No one can serve two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. *You cannot serve both God and money.*”

He also said “where your treasure is, there your heart is also.”

As followers of Jesus, we have to take seriously the call to give our money to the things that matter most. We want our hearts checked in to the things we most care about.

If you aren't a Christian, or aren't a part of this congregation, *this write up is not for you*. You are our guest here, and we hope you feel right at home. We are not asking for your money. For real.

If you *are a part of this church*, and this is your community, and we ask you to give to the work we are doing together.

Finally, when it comes to giving, we ask you to please consider giving via pre-authorized withdrawal (PAD). It's the simplest way for our congregation to set a sustainable budget and to steward our collective finances for mission.

It's also just *makes sense* because so many of us are cashless! *PAD* may seem a odd to some of us, but think about how you pay for most of the things you care about. Your rent or mortgage, your internet and your heating? Most of us use our debit card for day to day purchases. We used to give with cheques, and before that people used cash, and before that it was spices and animals. There is nothing more or less “spiritual” about bringing cash or cheque or cilantro or a goat to church! The important thing is that we are giving *regularly, sacrificially, and with a glad heart*.
