

Mobile Phone policy

Rationale

 Mobile phones are important modern day communication tools, essential in providing a safe and effective school environment. However, they can easily be improperly used, lost or damaged and must therefore be effectively managed.

Aims

To provide guidelines for the proper use of mobile phones by all persons attending EEPS

Implementation

- Teachers in charge of all excursions and trips involving students must ensure that they have mobile phones or similar appropriate communications devices to accompany each trip.
- Staff members are not to use mobiles phones for private calls during face to face time with students.
- Staff will be kept informed of Department of Education and Early Childhood Development (DEECD) information relating to health effects of using mobile phones.
- Students bringing mobile phones to school must turn them off and must not access them during the day.
- The school does not accept responsibility for lost or damaged mobile phones.
- All students are expected to follow the guidelines set down in the 'Safe Connections Program' and the Australian Government 'Cybersmart' initiative. http://www.cybersmart.gov.au/ when using this means of communication.
- Students to immediately report to their parent and teacher any inappropriate messages they receive.
- Students using personal mobile phones at school will have the mobile phone confiscated and their parents contacted.
- The principal may revoke a student's privilege of bringing mobile phones to school.
