Dear Friends,

Christmas is a time when we want to make special memories, wrap them up, and tie them with a bow. In our efforts to make Christmas "perfect," we could miss that Jesus's birth was perfect in its imperfections.

"And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth." - John 1:14

If we look at the situation around Jesus's birth, Joseph and Mary were a family in crisis. Giving birth to a child away from home and in a barn is far from ideal. When we hear the story, I never think that Mary and Joseph should have planned better. We feel compassion for this young mother and her family's situation, and we are saddened that no one helped them.

BCH's mission comes from James 1:27. We care for the father-less—the most vulnerable. One of these children is Bruce. We care for at-risk children, like Bruce, in three focused and meaningful ways:

Bruce is 17 years old, one of 8 grandchildren living together with Grandma Mary in Zambia. When we first began to assist this family, he was insecure and withdrawn, very

quiet, rarely smiled, and kept to himself. He had never been to school, was poorly clad, and refused to even try school because of his age. How could he start with the first graders? Sponsorship provided him with a secure house, blankets, adequate food, clothing, and private tutoring to learn to read in a safe environment of home and church. (continued on page 2)
