

COMMON OBJECTION

How do we know there is a God?

Do you *really* want to know? Be sure that you are not asking the question just to avoid meeting God! The philosopher Kierkegaard pointed out the danger of arguing God's existence in His presence. We know there is a God for three reasons:

First, nothing in this world is able to explain its own existence: thus, there must be a God in order to explain the world in which we find ourselves.

Secondly, you can't explain Jesus Christ unless God exists. When one of His disciples said to Him, "Show us the Father," Jesus replied: "Have I been so long with you and you don't know me?" (John 14:8-9).

Thirdly, your heart tells you there is a God; otherwise you wouldn't have asked the question. The Bible says: "The fool has said in his heart, there is no God" (Psalm 53:1).
