Dear Marist Friends,

After Mary received the invitation from the angel to be the mother of Jesus, she was impelled to go out and seek the company of her cousin Elizabeth to share this good news. We too are quick to seek out family and friends when we have some good news to share; it can be on social media within minutes.

This year's theme *FULL OF GRACE – Transform the World with God's Love*, challenges us to go out. When we experience the love of God, we will naturally want to go out and spread this good news too. Saint Marcellin reinforces this message when he says, 'children learn more through the eyes than the ears' (*Opinions, Conferences, XLI, pp. 310*).



Each person is already 'full of grace' as we are made in the image of our loving God. We are invited to discover, explore and engage with this love. What is within us needs to be provoked and teased out, often in the company of others.

I encourage you then to participate in this outstanding range of Marist programs and events to know and nurture this grace that is within you. It will enable you to witness to it and transform the world with love.

INTRODUCTION ON THE THEME FROM MR TONY CLARKE

DIRECTOR OF MARIST MISSION AND LIFE FORMATION

Full of Grace

"Now is the hour of love!" – Pope Leo XIV
"The Word became flesh and dwelt among us...full of grace and truth" – John 1:14

What if the world's peace and flourishing began not with grand gestures, but a humble yes?

Grace is that yes. It is God's love, freely given, undeserved, unmeasured, and without conditions. It is offered to everyone. When we receive it, something begins to change within us, reshaping our actions, our capacity to love, and how we engage with the world.

Grace, like love, is always a gift. Once accepted, it overflows from our hearts and radiates outward, moving us to share God's love with others. Grace is not abstract or distant; it is the living presence of God in the ordinary: a word of encouragement, listening with patience, a hand extended in peace. In these small acts, God's love moves through us, shaping us into instruments of grace.

Mary shows us what this looks like. When the angel greets her: "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you" (Luke 1:28), her yes was not timid or passive. It was bold and courageous. Her trust let God's love shape her life, her choices, her relationships, and her very being. That yes changed everything.

So what about us? What does saying yes look like today?

We live in a world that longs for peace and understanding, where fear and division can often overshadow hope. Yet grace shows us another way. It invites us to be bridge-builders where there are walls, to show understanding where there is judgement, and to choose love even when it feels easier to walk away. Grace is God's love in action: listening deeply, serving humbly, washing feet, kneeling in honour of the dignity of others, and rising with the conviction to stand for those who are powerless.

The challenge stands before us:

What kind of community are we becoming?

Are we willing to love beyond comfort, to forgive beyond fairness, to serve without counting the cost?

Who will we walk with, and what will we stand for?

Today, the question is simple and profound: Will our yes be bold? Will it be courageous?

This is not easy work, but it is holy work; the work that feeds our hearts and souls. Abbot Jamison captures its power beautifully:

"Grace is God's way of restoring our trust in the goodness of life. The relationship between goodness and grace can perhaps be understood by analogy with food. If food is nourishing, then it's considered to be full of goodness. Similarly, grace is a goodness that nourishes the soul; it feeds the good in us so that we can trust each other and flourish together." ¹

Through grace, our yes becomes nourishment, not only for ourselves, but for the world.

At his inauguration Mass, Pope Leo XIV reminded us:

"Now is the hour of love. The heart of the Gospel is the love of God that makes us brothers and sisters. We are called to offer God's love to everyone..." ²

He went on to stress:

"Our world, wounded by war, violence and injustice, needs to hear the Gospel message of God's love and to experience the reconciling power of Christ's grace." ³

Let us be that message. Be that grace. Now is the hour. Transform the world with God's love.




Image Reflection

In the image of Jesus kneeling to wash the feet of his disciples, we encounter grace in its most tangible form. God's love in action. This moment, quiet yet revolutionary, reveals the heart of the theme *Full of Grace – Transform the World with God's Love*. It is not a display of power or grandeur, but of humility, presence, and service.

The artwork comes from a series of icons titled *The Way of the Family* by Australian artist and iconographer Sue Orchison. In this image *Washing of the Feet*, "Jesus is servant: He humbles himself and asks us to do the same."

Jesus, "full of grace and truth" (John 1:14), chooses not to command but to kneel. He does not seek recognition but offers tender service. In this act, grace becomes visible: undeserved, unmeasured, freely given. It is a love that lowers itself to lift others up, a love that transforms.

This image invites us to reflect on our own "yes" to grace. Like Mary, whose bold and courageous yes allowed God's love to shape her life, we are called to echo that yes in our own time. In a world aching for peace, where division and fear often speak louder than hope, grace whispers another way. It asks us to kneel, to listen, to serve.

Let this image be our challenge and our inspiration. Let it remind us that grace is not abstract, it is the touch of God in the ordinary. And when we receive it, live it, and become it, we do more than reflect God's love, we transform the world with it.

Pope Leo's words are an invitation to a life open to grace, the gift of God's love. A gift that is transformative, that awakens our hearts and compels us to go out with compassion and share this love with those we encounter.

Through this program, participants will be invited to:

- Grow in understanding of grace, the free and undeserved gift of God's love in our lives
- Deepen their awareness of grace, present and active in the world
- Consider the transformative nature of Marist education in making Jesus known and loved in the lives of young people

The program provides opportunities to:

- Explore human experiences of God's love in the ordinary events of life
- Engage in contemplative reflection for each participant to consider graced moments in their own lives
- Engage with Scripture with an emphasis on the transformative power of the love of Jesus
- Discern how Catholic educators assist students to encounter the gift of God's love, offering a life of fullness and possibility



A three-day residential program for staff who have been in Marist schools and ministries for two years or more. It promotes, as a work of the Church, a Marian perspective on making Jesus Christ Known and Loved, which is the core mission of Marist education. It also explores Marist heritage, identity, pedagogy and spirituality.

Footsteps provides an opportunity for participants to strengthen their understanding and practice of Marist pedagogy using core documents, formation processes and community building. This understanding is enriched through gaining a greater appreciation of the Marist story and charism of Saint Marcellin Champagnat. It also provides a platform for participants to enrich and deepen their own faith journey through exploring contemplative practices of Marian spirituality.

This program is designed for educators who hold positions of Middle Leadership in Marist schools. It is an opportunity to explore and deepen their leadership capabilities within the Catholic schooling context, as well as mapping their professional and vocational growth as educators. It draws upon the Australian Professional Standards for Middle Leaders (AITSL2024) to build upon their understanding of teaching and leading in a Marist school with the enabling

dispositions of listening, open mindedness, interpersonal courage, empathy, perseverance and resilience.

This program is practical, future-oriented and provides spaces for ongoing reflection, learning and action. Based on the three Marist Virtues of Humility, Simplicity and Modesty and the writings of Saint Marcellin Champagnat, these interactive sessions will engage with contemporary research and practice, enabling participants to explore their sacred role within the school community.

CREATIVE FIDELITY TO THE CHARISM: A STUDY PROGRAM OF OUR MARIST ORIGINS AND LIVING SPIRITUALITY | \$690.00

This course will explore the spiritual heritage of the Marist tradition through the lens of the life, spirituality, and charism of Saint Marcellin Champagnat. It invites participants to journey deeply into the foundational inspiration of the Institute of the Marist Brothers, grounding them in the historical, spiritual, and pastoral context in which Marcellin responded to the needs of youth in 19th-century France. The course offers space for reflection on how this charism continues to inspire Marists of Champagnat today. Participants will explore how Marcellin's vision of forming "good Christians and good citizens" can shape their own lives, leadership, and mission.

Drawing on core texts such as *Water from the Rock, In the Footsteps of Marcellin Champagnat,* Saint Marcellin's letters and retreat offerings, Avis, Leçons, Sentences, participants will engage with the essential elements of Marist identity: presence, simplicity, family spirit, love of work, and following in the way of Mary.

LANGUAGE LEARNING COLLABORATIVE TIMOR LESTE

Expressions of Interest are now open for the 2026 MSA Language Learning Collaborative in association with the Catholic Institute for the Formation of Teachers (ICFP), Baucau, Timor-Leste. This Professional Development Program involves volunteer teachers from Australian Marist and Catholic Schools working alongside staff from the Catholic Institute to enhance their English language skills and functional use of English.

In 2026 the program will be available in two groups to coincide with the different school vacation periods across Australia (see dates below). Volunteer teachers are usually sponsored by their school or college. The approximate cost for the 2026 program will be around \$4,750. This

includes airfares, accommodation, and all meals. Volunteer teachers are matched with teaching or ancillary staff from the Catholic Institute and work with them to support their English language proficiency in reading, writing, speaking, and listening. Tutoring resources and support are provided prior to and during the program. Only six (6) places are available in each group.

MARIST FOURVIÈRE HIGHLIGHTS TOUR

From Rome to Fourvière

This inaugural *Marist Fourvière Highlights Tour* provides an opportunity to visit and experience the key sites that are so formative to the Marist story since the Fourvière Pledge in 1816. Commencing in Rome, the Eternal City, this 10-day tour offers participants a spiritual and historical journey through various Marist sites. The tour includes 9 nights of accommodation across Rome (3 nights), Lyon (2 nights), and The Hermitage (4 nights), and airfare between Rome and Lyon.

Highlights include a Papal Audience, visits to St Peter's Basilica, the Vatican, and various Marist General Houses in Rome. Following a short flight from Rome to Lyon, pilgrims will explore significant Marist locations in France such as Fourvière, Cerdon, La Neylière, Lavalla, Marlhes, and Le Rosey, culminating in a reflective experience at The Hermitage, the spiritual home of Champagnat Marists. The tour concludes at The Hermitage, with a morning transfer to Lyon for onward travel. International airfares are not included. Price to be confirmed.

The Marist Pilgrimage offers a transformative journey of spiritual and personal growth, inviting pilgrims to immerse themselves in the story of Jesus, the Church, and the Marist tradition. It begins in Rome, with a rich encounter of the early, universal, and Marial Church, drawing participants into the living history of faith.

The pilgrimage then continues to Assisi and Subiaco, where pilgrims experience two of the Church's great spiritual traditions, Franciscan and Benedictine. The journey culminates in France, where pilgrims visit the sacred sites connected to the life and mission of Saint Marcellin Champagnat. Walking together as Christian disciples and Marist pilgrims, participants are invited into deep reflection, shared learning, and a renewed awareness of God's presence in daily life and ministry.





In Australia, the Star of the Sea Province and Marist Association act in the name of the Church in four broad areas of ministry:

Marist Schools Australia

... is a family of 57 schools which draw on Marist spirituality and Marist educational practice to help them to shape their identity and mission as Catholic schools. Of these schools. 12 are solely governed by the Board of Marist Schools Australia I td and the rest are conducted in various partnership arrangements with dioceses and parishes. MSA schools, which help to educate over 40.000 young Australians, are arouped into three geographical Regions. Each Region is led by a Director who is advised by a MSA Regional Council.

Marist Youth Ministry

... is a ministry aimed at voung people aged between 12 and 25. MYM supports school-based and young adult programs. The principal school involvement is through the six-vear Christian leadership program known as Game Changers. A suite of postschool opportunities include prayer and worship, service and solidarity, forums and festivals, together with a range of local and international volunteering opportunities. MYM operates in all MSA Regions.

Marist180

is the Marist social welfare ministry and offers a range of programs and services that connect with and support young people and families in most critical need. It is headquartered in Western Sydney with a presence across greater Sydney, as well as Orange. Newcastle. Canberra and Brisbane. Marist180 provides training and services for First Nations support and engagement, homelessness, family preservation and refugee settlement. It also offers Intensive Therapeutic Care for young people living in Marist180 out-ofhome care: this latter service provides strong continuity and a link to our first work and ministry, St Vincent's Boys Home, founded in 1896.

Australian Marist Solidarity

... is the Marist ministry for aid and development work throughout Asia and the Pacific Islands. Australian Marist Solidarity, a registered NGO, works with the people in this region through projects that empower local communities to take their own path to development, with an emphasis on redressing poverty through the provision of education. It also offers educational and international solidarity awareness services for MSA schools and other Marist ministries.
