**POST-GRADUATE FELLOWSHIP OPPORTUNITY**

Lenox Hill Neighborhood House's Legal Advocacy Department is seeking to sponsor law students graduating in 2018, judicial law clerks completing their clerkships in 2018, and, where appropriate, recent law graduates, for fellowships in public interest law such as the Skadden Fellowship, the Equal Justice Works Fellowship and the Kirkland & Ellis Fellowship. **The Fellowship will commence in the Fall of 2018.**

Our talented team of thirteen lawyers and six legal advocates provide comprehensive civil legal services to thousands of low-income, often disenfranchised, individuals and families each year, including frail older adults, disabled and homeless people, immigrants, low-wage workers and low-income families. Our unique comprehensive legal practice, integrated within a larger social service and educational organization, connects our clients to the multi-disciplinary resources that are often necessary to tackle our society's most difficult challenges – lack of affordable housing, access to meaningful health care and critical income supports, and end-of-life planning.

Our previous legal fellows, including Skadden and EJW AmeriCorps, created and expanded our Workers' Rights Project and our Family Homelessness Prevention Project. We are currently seeking applicants who are interested in creating projects in one of the following areas: helping low income New Yorkers with government benefits issues, access to health care, disability rights, consumer law, workers' rights, and/or legal issues affecting older adults.

Lenox Hill Neighborhood House, widely recognized as one of New York's premier human services providers, is a 123-year-old settlement house that provides an extensive array of effective and integrated services—social, educational, legal, health, housing, mental health, nutritional and fitness—which significantly improve the lives of 15,000 people in need each year, ages 3 to 103, on the East Side of Manhattan. Our clients include older adults, homeless and formerly homeless adults, children and families, recent immigrants, disabled persons, adult learners and more.
