1. General

- 1.1. Deaf Health Initiative, Inc. ("Deaf Health Initiative," sometimes referred as "We," "Our," or "Us") operates <http://www.deafhealthinitiative.org> (the "Site"). Deaf Health Initiative's Privacy Policy informs the Site's visitors ("Visitors," "You" and "Your" refers to you, the person accessing the Site and accepting the Terms and Conditions) of our policies regarding the collection, use, and disclosure of personal information we receive from users of the website. Because Your privacy and protection of data is our top concern, please be assured that Deaf Health Initiative uses its best efforts to protect the privacy of Visitors to the website. To protect Your privacy and data, We have established and comply with principles in this policy.
- 1.2. Your access to the website's services (the "Services") is strictly conditioned upon Your agreement with and consent to the terms and conditions of Deaf Health Initiative's Privacy Policy and the policy may be amended and/or updated occasionally. By using the Site, You agree to the collection and use of information in accordance with this policy.
- 1.3. In the event of any change to the Deaf Health Initiative's Privacy Policy, Deaf Health Initiative will notify You of any changes by posting the updated Privacy Policy here on the Site. You are advised to review this Privacy Policy periodically for any changes. Deaf Health Initiative reserves the right to make changes to its policies and the Site at any time.
- 1.4. You also agree to comply with all of the terms and conditions of Deaf Health Initiative's Terms of Service Agreement, which is located at ---.

3. Use of the Services by You

- 3.1. In order to provide Services on the Site, Deaf Health Initiative may gather information about Visitors (such as identification or contact details) only when voluntarily submitted by Visitors. Visitors agree that any registration information Visitors give to Deaf Health Initiative through the Site will always be accurate, correct, and up to date. If at any time, Visitors would like to correct the personal information provided to Deaf Health Initiative or if Visitors would like to change preferences for contacts from Deaf Health Initiative, Visitors can let Deaf Health Initiative know by contacting the e-mail provided above. Deaf Health Initiative will make reasonable efforts to make the appropriate changes as soon as possible.
- 3.2. The following Services that require Visitors' personal information are as follows: 1.) Our newsletter, entitled "Stay Updated." You are asked to provide Your first name, last name, and e-mail address. By giving Deaf Health Initiative Your personal information, You give Deaf Health Initiative the permission to send You information, such as newsletters and event updates. If You do not elect to receive such materials, We will not send them to You. 2.) The contact form located under the tab entitled "Contact." You are asked to provide Your first name, last name, and e-mail address. By providing Your personal information and contacting Us through the contact form, You give Deaf Health Initiative the permission to contact You. Only Deaf Health Initiative has access to the information You provided and will not share such information with others. We do not sell, share, or rent Your personal information to any third party.
- 3.3. Certain pages of Deaf Health Initiative's Site may contain external links. If Visitors visit one of these linked sites, Visitors should review any and all of their privacy policies. We encourage You not to provide personal information without first assuring yourself of the privacy policies of such other websites. We do not monitor or review the content of other parties' websites that are linked to the Site. Deaf Health Initiative is not responsible in any way for any use and/or misuse of any personal information or other information provided by You at such other websites.
- 3.4. If Visitors make an online donation, personal information will be collected from Visitors in order to process that donation. Deaf Health Initiative uses a payment processor company, Stripe, Inc. ("Stripe") to accept credit card and debit card payments solely for online donations. Stripe exceeds the most stringent industry standards for security. It is

PCI-compliant, certified to PCI Service Provider Level 1. Stripe also forces HTTPS for all of its services. You agree that You are aware that third parties may use personally identifiable information to provide such services.

4. Log Data and Cookies

- 4.1. Like many site operators, Deaf Health Initiative collects information that Visitors' browser sends whenever Visitors visit the Site. This log data may include information such as Your computer's Internet Protocol (IP) address, browser type, browser version, the pages of the website that You visit, the time and date of Your visit, the time spent on those pages, time zones, and other statistics for aggregate use. Do note that IP addresses are not linked to personally identifiable information. Deaf Health Initiative may use the log data to analyze trends and to improve the Site and Services. Only Deaf Health Initiative has access to the data and will not share such data with others. We do not sell, share, or rent Your personal information to any third party.
- 4.2. Cookies are files with small amount of data, which may include an anonymous unique identifier. Cookies are sent to Visitors' browser from a website and stored on Visitors' computer's hard drive. Such use of cookies make Your use of the Site more convenient by remembering important information. Like many sites, Deaf Health Initiative uses the cookies to collect information but such information is not personally identifiable. You can instruct Your browser to refuse all cookies or to indicate when a cookie is being sent. However, if You do not accept cookies, You may not be able to take advantage of all the features on the Site.

5. Your Obligations

- 5.1. Visitors must, at all times, respect the terms and conditions of this Deaf Health Initiative's Privacy Policy, including but not limited to any intellectual property rights. Visitors also have certain obligations imposed by applicable law or regulations and by Deaf Health Initiative's Terms of Service Agreement. The terms are specified in Deaf Health Initiative's Terms of Service Agreement.
- 5.2. Visitors also agree not to access (or attempt to access) the Site by any means other than through the Site. You agree not to access (or attempt to access) any of the Services and the Site through any automated means (including use of scripts or web crawlers). You agree that you will not engage in any activity that interferes with or disrupts the Site.

- 5.3.** When using the Site and its Services, Visitors agree not to send, publish, post, upload, distribute, or disseminate any inappropriate threatening, abusive, profane, defamatory, infringing, obscene, indecent, or otherwise objectionable materials or any materials which encourage conduct that would constitute a criminal offense, give rise to civil liability or violate any law or contain any advertising or any solicitation with respect to products and services.
- 5.4.** Visitors also agree not to harass, abuse, threaten, or otherwise violate any legal rights of others. You agree not to attack, ridicule, denounce, impugn a person's character or impute immoral or dishonorable attributes to members on the basis of race or ethnicity, gender, age, religion, national origin, disability, or sexual orientation.

6. Children's Online Privacy

- 6.1.** Children are not eligible to use Deaf Health Initiative's services. Minors should not submit any personal information to Deaf Health Initiative and/or use Deaf Health Initiative's services. Deaf Health Initiative does not knowingly collect personal information from minors who are under 18 years of age.

7. Security and Legal Disclaimer

- 7.1.** The security of Your personal information is important to us, but remember that no method of transmission over the internet or method of electronic storage is 100% secure. While We strive to use commercially acceptable means to protect Your personal information, Deaf Health Initiative cannot guarantee its absolute security.
- 7.2.** IT IS POSSIBLE THAT WE MAY NEED TO DISCLOSE PERSONAL INFORMATION WHEN REQUIRED BY LAW, SUCH AS RESPONSES TO CIVIL OR CRIMINAL SUBPOENAS, OR OTHER REQUESTS BY LAW ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL. WE WILL DISCLOSE SUCH INFORMATION IN THE EVENT THAT WE HAVE A GOOD-FAITH AND REASONABLE BELIEF THAT IT IS NECESSARY TO COMPLY WITH A COURT ORDER, JUDICIAL PROCEEDING, SUBPOENA, OR OTHER LEGAL PROCESS OR REQUEST TO DEAF HEALTH INITIATIVE BROUGHT IN ANY COUNTRY THROUGHOUT THE WORLD, OR TO EXERCISE OUR LEGAL RIGHTS OR DEFEND AGAINST LEGAL CLAIMS.
