From Pastor Jack

A New Perspective

I own a book. Actually I owned many books. I have given most away. I gave them away the day I realized that the wisdom in those books was time stamped for a particular setting and reality. I gave them away because I wanted my life to be fluid. I have kept a few books I believe are worthy of returning to often. One of the books I have kept is, "Deep Change", by, Robert Quinn. It is a book about, discovering the leader within.

I needed to make changes in my life because back in the day, I was out of sync. As Quinn says, "While our underlying worldview is fairly fixed, our external world is constantly changing. The two become increasingly out of sync, and the maps or paradigms that serve to guide our behavior become obsolete." (Pg66)

For instance, although I am fairly set in my worldview, I have had to change a lot of personal things in my life. In High School I took a note taking class when I should have taken typing. That one single course would have helped me immensely in college. However, I did take really good notes. The issue was, I couldn't type a paper and it cost me grade wise. At least I no longer had to program those Vhs machines that I found impossible. Every year something changed. I have had three or four computers (desk tops) and found they did well, but a few years back I realized that I moved around a lot and thought a laptop would work well for me. I worked in a church for a year and the secretaries thought I would be well suited to an Apple MacBook that I am writing on now. I found I could write and work creatively wherever I was.

Since working at Church of Peace with you, I am finding that I have a wee bit of catch up to do with using new apps and other technologies. I am interested in learning. However, for someone born in the 1940's it is a challenge. I have to say, it is at times frightening and daunting.

I have come to believe that there are two types of people on the planet. One type does not like change, but welcomes it in order to grow. The other type doesn't like change and has decided to do whatever is possible to keep things as they are. Like the proverbial ostrich, they do not want assumptions challenged, or their viewpoints scrutinized. A man I dearly love is willing to die with furniture he bought sixty years ago even if it is not antique quality nor fit to sit on. I am not being critical of him. He is locked in a place and time that no longer exists. I am hoping against hope that I will keep my antiques and let go of stuff that is worn out. I even bought a new leather chair I am using tonight as I write. My old one had no lumbar support and the bottom was falling out. This new chair is nice. It both reclines and rocks.

What I am saying is this, let us keep the primary worldview we have and change the external things we must to keep living and growing in the world. I have decided to live fully every day until I die. I want to draw my last breath conscious of the wonder and beauty around me. I want my last breath to be a breath of appreciation for every opportunity life has afforded me. I want to be open mouthed at the glory of seeing our world and species evolve. To do that, I have to figure out how to use a stinking smart phone the way my grandkids do intuitively. I bought a Kindle five years ago. My then eleven-year-old grandson showed me how to download books. I felt silly learning from him. I appreciated his help, and the grace he extended me. Living in Italy I found I could do it on my own. He taught me to do that.

The world is changing. While I cannot keep up with change, I will do my best to stay in the game. More than that I will try to model for my grand children and you how to love, and include all people no matter their race, sexual orientation, age, political or religious bias. I will learn to embrace my neighbor with the love, grace and passion Jesus had. Love is, as I see it today, a sane alternative to the insanity of a world without it.

I find myself learning each day, in each new encounter, that I need to love others for my own mental health. I must, to live fully, make necessary changes daily.

Patrick Hanke and Connie Olson are in need of baskets for our Raffle, and also donations for the Raffle and for the Silent Auction.



Council Meeting — June 12, 2018 — Abbreviated Minutes

Present: Brenda Post, Victor Abitz, Jack Kiefer, O. James Braatz, Matt Moore, Tom Letourneau, Rob Giese
Meeting opened at 6:33 p.m. with a prayer by Brenda P.

Amy Barbian has resigned from the council so a new treasurer needs to be elected.

Tom L. will volunteer as treasurer if electronic banking can be used. Rev Jack would like to receive electronic paychecks (direct deposit). It was determined that more information is needed.

Election of a treasurer and the use of electronic banking were tabled until the next council meeting.

Open council position - council members suggested some congregation members. Brenda P. will reach out to them to find out if they are interested in the open position.

The Council approved to allow the Council President to inquire on church accounts. The Council approved for Council Treasurer and Council President to be signers on the Communion Account.

The Council decided, due to lack of air conditioning in the Sanctuary, worship will be in the Fellowship Hall starting this Sunday, June 17th until the end of August.

It was suggested that we have pew communion in July and, based on how it goes, determine which communion to do in August.

The Martha's Society made gift bags for the hospitalized and homebound members. As a reminder, please let council members or Rev Jack know if anyone is hospitalized. Right now the council is not aware of anyone.

Rob G. noted the need for a curriculum for the 2018-19 Sunday School year. Brenda P. to discuss with Jack.

Victor A. will represent COP at the River Park meeting June 13 at 8:30 am., as Rev Jack is unable to attend.

Salvation Army serves bagged lunches twice/week in summer. They're handed out in the COP parking lot.

The Church Picnic at Taylor Park will be held on August 19th.

A check for the church door repair was received by the Ladies of Peace. Brenda P. read a letter from the Ladies regarding their willingness to help pay for church needs. Brenda will send them "thanks" from the council.

The Council shared responses to the Northeast Association survey.

Rev Jack will be holding workshops for church groups. The 1st one is scheduled for Sat., Sept. 8 from 9 - noon.

A new lamp for the piano at the front of the sanctuary was purchased and paid for solely through private donations. The previous lamp was damaged beyond repair.

Rob G. expressed the urgent need for volunteers to water plants, trees, etc. Ideally this would be done every other day depending on weather (every day if hot). Supervisor still needed to coordinate exterior activities.

Ceiling fans in the Sanctuary will be turned on for Sunday services when services are back in the Sanctuary.

Locks for all exterior electrical outlets will be purchased to eliminate unauthorized use.

Meeting adjourned at 8:09 p.m. with the Lord's Prayer.

The next Council meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, July 10th at 6:30 p.m.

SYMBOLS IN OUR SANCTUARY

Symbols for Holy Communion and for Holy Baptism are superimposed upon a rugged cross. The bases of each are pointed, angle directed toward the Church. The tops are angled away from the Church indicating that, as the sacraments are rooted in Christ and the Church, they are intended for all who are willing to believe.

Holy Communion symbol on South side of church: there is a large chalice and wafer at the center. Grapes are clustered around the left arm of the cross. The grape vine becomes the Crown of Thorns as it circles the center of the cross. Wheat is clustered around the right side of the cross, extends beyond the lower portion of it indicating that the sacrament is intended for all believers.

Holy Baptism symbol on north side of church: below the left arm of the Cross is a sea shell, an early Christian symbols for Baptism. Water flows from the shell, descends across the base of the cross to indicate that this sacrament is the symbol of entry into the Church, and is intended by Christ, as He has said, for "all the world".

Lower right of the cross: figure of the Descending Dove, representing the Holy Spirit. Around the head of the dove is a golden rayed nimbus, indicates the spirit of God that descended like a dove at Christ's baptism by John. These 2 Symbols were commissioned by the Decorating Committee (Melvin Streeter, Mrs. Robert Herrenbruck, Mrs. Fred Lawrence, Francis Oberreich and Mrs. Harry Stangby) on May 13, 1986. Each symbol is carved from a single piece of linden wood and created by craftsmen of the A.R.S Studios of Ortisei, Italy. Both were gifts by members of the church who prefer to remain anonymous in memory of loved ones.

PEACE BE WITH YOU – The entrance symbol hangs above the entrance to the church. In the center of the Sunburst appear the Latin letters I.H.S. A cross arises out of the "H", giving it the appearance of the Cross and Crown, another symbol for salvation. The letters when combined with the Cross indicate the Latin words: "In Hoc Salus" – literally translated, it means "In this sign (the cross) is salvation." Each side has olive branches, a sign of Peace. Below the Sunburst is a scroll effect on which are written the words of Christ "Peace Be With You." This is a fitting word for worshippers as they enter or leave.

At the Annual Meeting on December 14, 1986, an announcement was made that this Symbol was a gift from Mr. & Mrs. Clarence Boyke in memory of their loved ones. Symbols were dedicated on March 29, 1987.
