1.0 Approval of Minutes July 3, 2008

2.0 Current Resident Progress (Vanessa Paquette)

2.1 Rotation Update

- Vanessa is in her second week of the Oncology Rotation
- Dispensary, General Peds, DPIC, Nephrology, and Infectious Disease rotations have been completed so far. You can access her teaching schedule on the pharmacy Team Site under the "Education" folder.

2.2 Residency Case Presentation - Friday, January 29th, 2009

- Vanessa will be using her ID rotation case presentation "HIV+ Pediatric Tuberculosis"

3.0 Project Update (Vanessa Paquette)

- Ethics Approval obtained Nov 7th, 2008.
- Extravasation injuries from January 1st 1998 – August 31st 2008 will be included in the chart review
- Patients for chart review have been identified from Hyaluronidase dispensing log in the pharmacy department and Quality and Risk data
 - PSLS can only go back two years
 - Screening the quality and risk data has been tedious since the data is not specific to extravasation injury.
 - To date 100 charts have been reviewed and 14 patients were found to be eligible for inclusion.
 - Awaiting NICU data from Dr. Avash Singh
- Roxane noted that this data collection needs to be done retrospectively or patient consent is necessary.

4.0 Review standard template for rotation objectives

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- Group had a discussion about clarifying learning objectives vs. rotation specific objectives. There was some concern there may be too many objectives to complete and that there needs to be a way of prioritizing the objectives.
- Consensus summary:
 - Rename the “Learning Objectives” as “BC Pharmacy Practice Residency Program Objectives” and to leave the “Rotation Specific Objectives” as is
 - To include a preamble prior to the “BC Pharmacy Practice Residency Program Objectives” in order to highlight these objectives are for all clinical rotations in the program.
 - If a “Rotation Specific Objective” is not covered this should be reflected on the evaluation form and the residency coordinator will pass this on to the next preceptor

- Rumi is working on a draft teaching schedule for the upcoming 2009-10 residents

 - 1 week Women's Health rotation will be reviewed
