Volunteer Opportunity – Adah’s Stairway

In the beautiful Buena Vista neighborhood there is a tucked away stairway at the bottom of Buena Vista Park. It’s a simple stretch of land connecting the park with the Haight neighborhood and is home to some very impressive pollinator habitat. The stairway’s name is a tribute to Adah Bakalinsky, author of the *Stairway Walks in San Francisco*. This space embodies our mission of connecting communities with their local nature by transforming a once derelict space into a safe and beautiful walkway that brings communities together. As beautiful as the space is now there is still a lot that it needs from enthusiastic people like you.



Location: (Top of Stairway) 101 Buena Vista Ave E., (Bottom of Stairway) Corner of Waller and Broderick St.

Time: 3rd Sunday of the month from 10am until 12pm

Role Descriptions:

Volunteers – As a volunteer for the Adah Stairway project you’ll be expected to attend our monthly workday doing everything from minor weeding to plant transplanting. This role is perfect for individuals looking for volunteer hours and for local residents wanting to preserve their local environment.

Site Steward – A site steward role is more time intensive as they will have the responsibility of coordinating and supervising volunteers on the monthly workdays, as well as be responsible with keeping track of equipment use and storage space maintenance. On the scheduled workday this person will also be responsible for a Nature in the City sign in sheet in order to keep track of our ongoing work and community engagement. The steward will have direct communication with Nature in the City staff leading up to the scheduled workday. This is an ideal role for local residents who have supervisory experience and/or have managed volunteers in the past.
