Volunteer Opportunity - Green Hairstreak Corridor

The Sunset District of San Francisco is home to one of the smallest butterfly species endemic to the Bay area. The Green Hairstreak butterfly spends its short lifecycle on the native plants found among the few pockets of habitat left in the area. Nature in the City was instrumental in preventing this tiny pollinator from disappearing altogether by restoring every bit of green space from Hawk Hill, on the corner of 14th and Rivera, to a small triangular median on the corner of Aloha and Lomita. Our mission of connecting communities to their local nature was the driving force that made this project so successful. Continuing that success can only happen with passionate and dedicated volunteers like you.



Location: Rotates on a monthly basis throughout the 11 habitat sites from 14th Ave. and Rivera up to Aloha and Lomita

Time: 3rd Saturday of the month from 10am until 12pm

Role Descriptions:

Volunteers - As a volunteer at the Green Hairstreak Corridor you'll be expected to attend our monthly workday doing everything from minor weeding to planting and even species monitoring (previous experience required). This role is perfect for individuals looking for volunteer hours and for local residents wanting to preserve their local environment.

Site Steward - A site steward role is more time intensive as they will have the responsibility of coordinating and supervising volunteers on the monthly workdays, as well as be responsible with keeping track of equipment use. On the scheduled workday this person will also be responsible for a Nature in the City sign in sheet in order to keep track of our ongoing work and community engagement. The steward will have direct communication with Nature in the City staff leading up to the scheduled workday. This is an ideal role for local residents who have supervisory experience and/or have managed volunteers in the past. The corridor has 11 different sites, of which about 5 have dedicated stewards, so there is plenty of space for all those interested
